moderate winds from NW to SE & thick & rainy by squalls at 8 set double reef
at 8 A.M. topsail & Tack SE watch employed in washing the deck the day ends cloudy weather
baromet 29²/₁₀ Tack South Latt in 7 04 35.52 South long in 7 chronomet. 46.48 west

202 Remarks on Saturday February 14th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with A fine breeze from NW & cloudy weather steering
at 6 P.M. South watch employed in washing the deck rain by squalls at 2 P.M. Tack North
baromet 29¹/₁₀ it came in thick & began to rain at 4 P.M. took in all sail but A short
reef main topsail & Tack NW at 8 past 8 luffed to the wind heading NW
at 9 P.M. set the fore sail at 1 A.M. the wind helled to the NW & made all
at 8 A.M. sail at 8 A.M. helled up strong breeze in sail down to double reef topsail watch employed
baromet 29¹/₁₀ in ships duty & taking volume the day ends strong breeze from NW & rough sea on
Latt in 7 04 35.30 South long in 7 chronomet. 47.38 west
