

217 Remarks on Sunday February 29th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from the E & fine weather steering
at 6 P.M. by the wind to the Eastward watch employed in ship duty at 6 P.M. Tack-
leant 29th 28th ship to the NW & saw one strong sail middle part of the day fine breeze
latter part more moderate & fine weather at 4 past 3 tack ship to the
Eastward at 7 tack to the NW at 2 past 4 tack ship & headed E & S
at 6 A.M. one topsail schooner in sight to leeward steering by the wind the day more
leant 29th 28th with light winds & fine weather
Set in by 20.05 South long in by chronometer 37.15 west

218 Remarks on Monday March 1st 1852

There 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from the E & fine weather
at 6 P.M. steering by the wind to the E & S & E one topsail schooner to the leeward
leant 29th 28th steering the same at 4 saw a whaling barque off our lee bow steering to the
NW by the wind at 4 past 6 P.M. we tack ship to the NW by middle
& latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather at 2 A.M. tack ship
at 6 A.M. to the E & S at 5 tack ship & headed from NW to the NW by watch
leant 29th 28th employ about the ship one sail off our lee beam the day more fine weather
Set in by 19.10 South long in by chronometer 37.15 west

219 Remarks on Tuesday March 2nd 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from the E & fine
at 6 P.M. weather steering by the wind to the NW watch employed about the rigging
leant 29th 28th one sail to the leeward steering by the wind to the NW at 6 P.M. A barque
peeped to the windward of us steering to the NW by the wind was exchanged
signals she was an American barque dup loaded at 6 P.M. we tack
ship to the NW by & headed ship by at 4 past 4 she came up at 4 A.M. to
at 6 A.M. latter part of the day fine breeze from E & S & fine weather watch
leant 29th 28th employ in making signal out one strong sail off our lee beam at 11
we took a squally of wind & rain we tack ship & headed up East
& E but the day more rain & squally
Set in by account 18.00 South long in by chronometer 37.10 west

220 Remarks on Wednesday March 3rd 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a breeze from the E & fine weather steering to the eastward
at 6 P.M. by the wind at 1 P.M. head of masted the mast heads & commenced trying our net
leant 29th 28th at 2 P.M. calm at 4 past 3 headed the boat & headed the mob of the ship outside at 4 past
11 A light breeze sprang up from the E & S at 6 saw a strong sail to the windward
at 4 past 6 tack ship & headed both masts & latter part of the day fine breeze &
fine weather sound and sail time through the night & tack ship several times
at 5 A.M. through the day saw several sails watch employ in ship duty at 4 past 11
leant 29th 28th tack ship to the E & S the day more fine weather
Set in by 16.52 South long in by chronometer 37.18 west

221 Remarks on Thursday March 4th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from the E & fine weather steering
at 6 P.M. by the wind to the E & S watch employ in trying a net one strong sail to the
leant 29th 28th windward steering by the wind to the NW at 6 P.M. we tack ship & headed up
from NW to the NW by middle & latter part of the day moderate winds & fine weather steering
to the NW by the wind watch employ in ship duty hooking off 12 provision bands
broke out the blubber room after wood pump on board of vinegar & one cask
at 6 A.M. of fresh water in the ground tier next to main mast saw two strong sails
leant 29th 28th the day more with a light breeze & fine weather on by to the leeward
Set in by 15.10 South long in by chronometer 37.30 west

222 Remarks on Friday March 5th 1852

There 24 Hours begins nearly calm & fine pleasant weather watch employ in getting
at 6 P.M. wood out of the hold & taking up some meat & pumpies on each of fresh water next
leant 29th 28th by the main mast & fine with salt water on by in sight at 1 P.M. we tack
ship to the NW at 2 calm at 4 P.M. finished steering off & were ship to the NW
at 5 P.M. the wind headed up from E & S & saw the masts & latter part of the
day moderate breeze from E & S to E & S & fine weather steering by the wind heading
at 6 A.M. from NW to the NW watch employ in starting fresh water out of the ground tier
leant 29th 28th in to the top bar saw porpoise the day more fine weather
Set in by 14.10 South long in by chronometer 37.00 west
