barent 292⁴⁰ employed in ship duty getting ready for anchoring & hauled the shrouds at 6 P.M.
were got through the passage & shot down sail & lay back & forward through the rig at
at 5 A.M. made all sail saw two whales coming out of Prince Rupert bay
at 6 the brig Maria 140 tons & barque Nye 170 tons spoke us with letters &
at 8 A.M. capt. Laker came on board they were bound to St. Thomas at 10 A.M. we came
barent 292⁴⁰ to anchor in Prince Rupert bay fished coils & commenced heaving out our catch
& getting them ready to go on shore the day ends the same fine weather

243 Remarks on Friday March 26th 1852

There 24 hours begins with fine weather lying to anchor in Prince Rupert bay
at 6 P.M. all hands employed in heaving out catch & putting on back to go on shore to fill with
barent 292⁴⁰ water at 4 P.M. went on shore with a raft of catch & filled them mial & latter part
of the day moderate breeze & variable & some showers by spells at 7 went on
shore & brought off 10 cask of water & hauled it in & commenced cleaning
at 8 A.M. off the ship outside the bay ends fine weather lying to anchor
barent 292⁴⁰ left in 7th day 16.38 North Long in 4 chronometer 61.31 west

There 24 hours begins with fine weather lying to anchor in Prince
