

247 Remarks on Tuesday March 30th 1852

There 24 hours begins with fine weather laying to anchor in Prince Rupert Bay all hands employed in painting the starboard side of the ship inside & outside at sun down finished the starboard side mizzen & latter part of the day fine weather at 8 AM the starboard watch went on shore on liberty & the larboard watch employed in painting the ship the barque Adventure of London capt Macarthur came in to anchor 12 months out 23rd lbs the day was fine weather

248 Remarks on Wednesday March 31st 1852

There 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & fine weather laying to anchor in Prince Rupert Bay in company with the barque Adventure of London the larboard watch employed in painting & the starboard watch on liberty at sun down the liberty men came on board at 4 PM & came on board mizzen & latter part of the day fine weather the starboard watch employed in painting the lower mast the larboard watch went on shore on liberty the day was with fine weather laying to anchor

249 Remarks on Thursday April 1st 1852

There 24 hours begins with fine weather laying to anchor in Prince Rupert Bay in company with the barque Adventure larboard watch went on shore & the starboard watch painting the lower mast at sun down finished painting all the mast & brought off the liberty men mizzen & latter part of the day fine weather at 7 AM the starboard watch went on liberty & the larboard watch employed in painting & cutting up wood on shore the day was with fine weather laying to anchor

250 Remarks on Friday April 2nd 1852

There 24 hours begins with fine weather laying to anchor in Prince Rupert Bay in company with the barque Adventure starboard watch on liberty & the larboard watch employed in painting & cutting up wood on shore at sun down the liberty men came on board mizzen & latter part of the day fresh breeze & fine weather larboard watch went on shore on liberty & the starboard watch employed in painting the larboard side of the ship outside & inside the day was the same laying to anchor

251 Remarks on Saturday April 3rd 1852

There 24 hours begins with a fresh breeze here & fine weather laying to anchor in Prince Rupert Bay the larboard watch on shore on liberty & the starboard watch employed in painting the larboard side of the ship outside & inside at 3 PM the schooner Palmyra capt Ramont & big tileron capt swain of Nanueton came to anchor here the schooner had 50 lbs big don of our own finished painting outside & inside all but 2 doors the liberty men all came on board mizzen & latter part of the day fine weather at 8 AM the starboard watch went on liberty & the larboard watch employed in finished painting & other various kinds of work the day was fine weather

252 Remarks on Sunday April 4th 1852

There 24 hours begins with fine weather laying to anchor in Prince Rupert Bay in company with the Adventure Palmyra & tileron starboard watch on liberty & the larboard watch finished painting & other various kinds of work on board at sun down the liberty men all came on board mizzen & latter part of the day fine weather at 8 AM the larboard watch went on shore on liberty the day was fine weather laying to anchor

253 Remarks on Monday April 5th 1852

There 24 hours begins with fine weather laying to anchor in Prince Rupert Bay in company with the Adventure Palmyra & tileron larboard watch on liberty at sun down the liberty men all came on board but Charles B Gibbs mizzen & latter part of the day rainy by spells at 9 AM the mizzen got ready for stowing down water sent on shore after a boat load of wood the day was all hands employed in stowing down wood & water

254 Remarks on Tuesday April 6th 1852

There 24 hours begins with drily weather & shells all hands employed in beating of wood & stowing down water & wood mizzen & latter part of the day fine weather all hands employed in beating off wood & stowing off wood & water the day was fine weather
