

255 Remarks on Monday April 7th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fine weather, lying to anchor in Prince Rupert's bay all hands employed in stowing off wood & water. At 6 P.M. cutting up wood on shore & loading of wood made & latter part of the day fine weather all hands employed in cutting up wood on shore at 8 A.M. loading of wood & stowing of wood & water went on shore & filled 2 cask board 292^{1/2} with & brought them on board so near this day.

256 Remarks on Thursday April 8th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fine weather, lying to anchor in Prince Rupert's bay all hands employed in stowing away wood & water. At 6 P.M. latter part of the day raining & shells all hands employed in loading of wood & stowing it away the day ends good weather lying to anchor.

257 Remarks on Friday April 9th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with good weather, lying to anchor in Prince Rupert's bay in company with 3 whalers all hands employed in stowing down wood at 4 P.M. got all the wood & water down Doctor & Dr. Richards Foreman's sweeping came on board & spent the evening inside & latter part of the day fine weather all hands employed in setting up the main & topmast shroues & painting the two quarter boats & masting gill & varnished the wheel at 10 A.M. the large & adventure took her anchor & went to Rossau the day ends fine weather.

258 Remarks on Saturday April 10th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fine weather, lying to anchor in Prince Rupert's bay with the halcyon & the liston all hands employed in painting the quarter boats & finished them & got all ready for sea at 7 P.M. Nathan Smith & carpenter came on board & settled up at 4 A.M. we took our anchor & stood to sea bound to St. Eustacia after vegetables fine weather & moderate breeze at 10 A.M. the wind backed up at five hours the day ends the same left in 404 15.47 at long in 4 hours and 61.55 west.

259 Remarks on Sunday April 11th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze & fine weather, standing at anchor at 8 P.M. stood out with stand at 10 A.M. middle part of the day fine breeze & fine weather at 8 A.M. stood at 8 A.M. at 9 A.M. came to anchor at St. Eustacia & fresh water boat came on board from the shore the day ends fine weather lying to anchor left in 404 17.36 west.

260 Remarks on Monday April 12th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fine weather, lying to anchor at St. Eustacia at 1 P.M. the last boat watch went on shore on liberty at 2 P.M. an English boy came in here to anchor at sun down the liberty men came on board inside & latter part of the day fine weather all hands employed in painting the iron work out side & fitted the feet of the main & topmast went on shore & purchased some vegetables the day ends fine weather.

261 Remarks on Tuesday April 13th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fine weather, lying to anchor at St. Eustacia at 1 P.M. the last boat watch went on shore on liberty at 2 P.M. the yams came on board at sun down the liberty men came on board John Horrocks & James P. Brown, dined down with inside & latter part of the day fine weather at 8 A.M. I went on shore to settle up my affairs at midday came on board so near this day.

262 Remarks on Wednesday April 14th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fine weather & moderate breeze at 1 P.M. we took our anchor & stood to sea stood at anchor at 8 P.M. I shipped two men to Eustacia by the name of Thomas Matthew & Emanuel Macdonald at 9 P.M. stood at anchor inside & latter part of the day light breeze & pleasant weather at 8 A.M. stood at anchor inside & latter part of the day fine weather all hands employed in mending & cleaning the waist boat & other various kinds of work on board at 10 A.M. in sight the day ends with light breeze.
