

270 Remarks on Tuesday April 22nd 1852
 I fitted a new bar form
 & put it in my berth
 but out for convenience
 There 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NNE & sailing down
 at 6 P.M. & some smoke, steering ESE watch employed about the ship picking
 barrel 292¹/₂ of alum & other various kinds of work on board one strong breeze of the
 the lunar steering ESE & E middle & latter part of the day fine breeze
 & southerly weather steering ESE watch employed in ships duty saw
 at 6 A.M. two strong sails both barques one steering ESE & the other West by
 barrel 292¹/₂ the day more overcast
 Let in by 20.10 North long in by chronometer 50.00 west

271 Remarks on Wednesday April 23rd 1852
 There 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NNE & southerly
 at 6 P.M. overcast weather steering ESE watch employed in ships duty
 barrel 293¹/₂ saw one barque steering West by & one barque in ship's wake
 big steering by the wind to the Eastward at 4 P.M. it began to rain
 at 5 A.M. rain very hard & blowing strong from NW the ship in light
 sails at 2 P.M. it blew up some moderate sail the wind backed
 at 6 A.M. to the South middle & latter part of the day fine breeze & light breeze
 barrel 294¹/₂ shells from South runner to North & from the East & sailing
 by shells & thick weather the day more the same
 Let in by 20.00 North long in by the same 53.10 west

272 Remarks on Saturday April 26th 1852
 There 24 hours begins with moderate winds from about East
 at 6 P.M. & thick & rainy weather by shells steering by the wind to the North
 barrel 295¹/₂ at 3 P.M. the wind backed round to the South steered ESE middle part
 of the day thick & rainy by shells latter part fair weather & smooth
 at 6 A.M. southerly watch employed in picking oakum & other work on board
 barrel 296¹/₂ the day more the same nothing in sight
 Let in by 20.10 North long in by chronometer 54.04 west

273 Remarks on Sunday April 27th 1852
 There 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NW & southerly & southerly
 at 6 P.M. weather steering ESE watch employed in ships duty picking oakum & much
 barrel 297¹/₂ a new misal's gill net middle & latter part of the day fine breeze from
 1 P.M. to 6 P.M. at 6 P.M. steered ESE at 8 A.M. saw halibut grass & sea
 at 6 A.M. saw fish & some pieces of squid & heavy smoke bearing from NW the day more the same
 barrel 298¹/₂ Let in by 20.59 North long in by chronometer 52.26 west

274 Remarks on Monday April 28th 1852
 There 24 hours begins with fine breeze from NW & fair weather & a heavy
 at 6 P.M. smoke bearing from NW to steering ESE at 11 steered NW & NW by N middle
 barrel 299¹/₂ & double reefed for the sea middle & latter part of the day fine breeze & fair weather
 by shells & southerly by shells at 6 A.M. land down the main to port & fitted the
 barrel put some pieces of board under the barrel & shined the barrel over forward
 at 6 A.M. further & set the tows & top gallant tows again at 8 A.M. steered ESE
 barrel 300¹/₂ watch employed in picking oakum & other work on board at midday steered East
 Let in by 20.33 North long in by chronometer 49.10 west

275 Remarks on Tuesday April 29th 1852
 There 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NW & southerly & some
 at 6 P.M. squalls rising up from the NW & steering East watch employed in sailing
 barrel 301¹/₂ up the main tows & main top gallant tows at 4 A.M. the wind backed
 at 6 A.M. at 6 A.M. steered ESE & made all sail latter part of the day moderate & a smoke
 bearing from the NW the watch employed in sailing up the main tows & the ship
 at 6 A.M. ends of main tows & bars at 11 the wind began to blow from NW & southerly
 barrel 302¹/₂ this day saw a fin back at midday luff'd to the NW & by the wind
 Let in by 20.33 North long in by chronometer 47.18 west

276 Remarks on Wednesday April 30th 1852
 There 24 hours begins with a moderate breeze from NW & good weather
 at 6 P.M. a large swell bearing from the NW steering by the wind bearing ESE watch
 barrel 303¹/₂ employed in ships duty about the rigging at the part 1 P.M. steered ESE at 4
 steered ESE at 1 A.M. calm latter part of the day calm weather & pleasant
 at 6 A.M. weather watch employed in ships duty broke out the fore hole & got out some
 barrel 304¹/₂ put in the studding sails & got out some shunters & retelling shiff thong
 more calm Let in by 20.34 North long in by chronometer 45.54 west

277 Remarks on Thursday April 29th 1852
 There 24 hours begins with calm weather & pleasant watch employed in ships
 at 6 P.M. duty steered off the fore hole set up main stay & sailed the wind up over at 6 P.M.
 barrel 305¹/₂ at 6 A.M. heavy opening up from NW to steered ESE & made sail middle &
 latter part of the day moderate breeze from NW & fine weather watch employed
 at 6 A.M. in ships duty set up the main tows & main top gallant head stay saw
 barrel 306¹/₂ fin back & grass pass at 10 steered ESE at midday steered East set all sail
 the eye let in the shank's gaff & set to hook so more this day
 Let in by 20.35 North long in by chronometer 44.20 west
