200 Remarks on Sunday May 2^d 1852

These 24 hours begin with a fine breeze from NW & fine weather during East watch employed in ship's duty various times. At 24² of work at 11 P.M. Star & B.P. at 5 the wind began to bear on strong at 2 past P.M. began to take in sail & took in down to double reef to sails through the night blowing strong in squalls at 3 A.M. it began to rain some at 4 past 4 rained hard at 5 the wind shifted from NW to SW in a squall called all hands & took in sail at 6 A.M. set up main top sail & luffed to the wind to the starboard at 7 A.M. began 24² Star East & began to make sail again at 9 am. bar with passing clouds made all muckery sail the day ends with a fresh breeze lat in 304 30.20 N long in 3 chronomet. 35.53 west

201 Remarks on Monday May 3rd 1852

Then 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NNE & rising slowly.
at 6 PM steering East at 1 PM saw a bang lying to leeward steering E & S at 2 PM
brought 24 ³⁴/₄₀ weather & B. S. Letter parts of the day moderate breeze & fine weather at
5 AM the wind shifted to the NW & steady & the wind backing from E & S
at 8 AM to 1 E B. S. watch employed about the rigging the day over with fine weather
brought 27 ²⁸/₄₀ heading 1 E B. S. nothing in sight
lost in fog 3 P. 34 at long 114 40 minutes 32-40 miles

 porpoise in the water at 11 but 11 A.M. saw a large porpoise & a whale carcass
 at 6 A.M. of our weather beam 11 miles off the day fine light winds & fine weather

283 Primates on Monday May 5th 1852

When 24 hours begins with light winds from East & fine weather steering
 at 6 P.M. by the wind to the NE water employed in ships duty some strange thing in
 baromet 30 $\frac{7}{8}$ sight off our weather beam spar or cask at 2 P.M. tacked ship to the north
 at 4 tacked to the SE at 8 P.M. put 4 sails & strong barque steering to the
 westward at 5 I caught one porbeuse miale & latter part of the day
 light winds from ENE to ESE & fine weather at 8 A.M. saw a vision
 big steering to the NW at 7 we tacked ship to the NW water
 at 6 A.M. employed in ships duty the day once with light winds & fine weather

204 Remarks on Thursday May 6th 1852

These 24 hours begin with light winds from E to SE & fine weather
at 6 PM stinging by the wind to the NE E. watch employed in ships only about the
baromet 30.9^{ths} rising at 4 the baromet up NE & E at 7 we caught on paper saw a
plenty of finbacks at 9 calm at 2 AM A light breeze sprang up from
South made sail & steamed East latter part of the day light winds from
at 6 AM NW & fine weather watch employed in ships only saw one strong sail
baromet 30.9^{ths} saw paper at 10 on bent for top yellow sail & put it in cash & shot
bulletins & Halcyon de at midday steamed E & B I saw the day fine weather
sailed in 4.04 38.20 N Long in 3.30 baromet 30.2 E watch

285 Remarks on Friday May 7th 1852

There 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from NW & fine weather clearing
at 6 PM. E.B. watches empty. in ships and various kinds of work of our down station was
lowest 20 fms & shows watches the Island Royal bearing E.B. 4 gun ship was seen at 4 PM
at 8 o'clock at 9 was helped to the water with for to leave about latter part of the day first hours at
lowest 20 fms. light made good & then in 1/2 the lower saws & shows sails the 4 gun ship first hours strong
