

311 Remarks on Monday June 2^d 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with light airs from the NE & fine pleasant weather
 at 6 P.M. A smooth sea between Graciosa & the group's head several sails in sight watch employed in watching them saw pinbacks & passed at 3 P.M. were ship towards Graciosa at sundown shot one sail near to Graciosa made & latter part of the day light breeze from NE & pleasant weather
 at 6 A.M. at 5 A.M. were ship in for the land & made sail worked the mizzenmast on bent the jib & repaired & mizzenmast. It at 7 o'clock off from the land at sundown tacked in shore one sail in sight so now this day

312 Remarks on Tuesday June 3^d 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with light winds from the South & fine smooth pleasant weather steering in to the westward by the wind towards Graciosa
 at 6 P.M. saw one sail in sight finished the jib & bent it at sun down shot one sail making of from the land made & latter part of the day light airs & wind by shifts & calms at 5 A.M. made sail & stood in towards Graciosa on bent the fore topmast & commenced mizzenmast taking it
 at 6 A.M. at 9 A.M. saw a strong sail & a plenty of pinbacks the day now more calm

313 Remarks on Wednesday June 4th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with light breeze from the NE & fine weather watch employed in minding the fore topmast at 1 P.M. at 2 P.M. the hummer spruce the big of Bruce capt River spoke us & I went on board & made out clean at 4 P.M. were finished the fore topmast & bent it the wind shifted round to the North the hummer spruce the big & Nicholas capt River came down 100 lbs humphreys 25 furs & the Lagony capt Janny of mottopoint 50 lbs also brought Mureator macomber 85 lbs & 2 others in sight
 at 6 A.M. at 11 P.M. capt macomber came on board nearly calm
 at 6 P.M. at 11 P.M. in the morning & then went on board & made sail & stood for Graciosa & whales in sight saw pinbacks by 11 winds from the NE & calms this day now the same

314 Remarks on Saturday June 5th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with light breeze from the NE & calm & cloudy weather steering
 at 6 P.M. 18 for the island towards several whales in sight in towards the group
 at 4 P.M. the wind blew up from the NE & stood in for Graciosa at sun down the whale with bow & compass 100 lbs distant shot one sail & stood by the wind to the South latter part of the day fine breeze from the NW & fair weather
 at 6 A.M. at 5 A.M. were ship to the NE & made all sail watch employed in ships duty
 at 6 P.M. various kinds of work at sundown tacked ship to the NE & now this day

315 Remarks on Sunday June 6th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from the Westward & fine weather
 at 6 P.M. steering by the wind to the NE watch employed in ships duty about the ship
 at 6 P.M. saw one portuguese sloop at sun down shot one sail & were ship to the NE
 at 6 A.M. latter part of the day fine breeze from the NW & fine weather at 6 A.M. made all sail & stood by the wind to the NE & saw one merchant brig & passed it on down
 at 6 P.M. tacked ship to the NE & so now this day fine weather
 at 6 A.M. left in 70 39.34 in long in 7 short in 25.25 short

316 Remarks on Monday June 7th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from the Westward & fine weather
 at 6 P.M. received in sight at 1 P.M. from South bound over to St Michael's saw one
 at 6 P.M. strong sail at sun down shot one sail & kept her South made & latter part of the day light winds & fine weather at 5 A.M. made sail & on bent the fore sail & commenced repairing it saw two strong sails & a plenty of pinbacks at 11
 at 6 A.M. at 11 P.M. saw St Michael's Island & had so now this day fine weather
 at 6 P.M. left in 70 38.32 in long in 7 short in 25.25 short

317 Remarks on Tuesday June 8th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with light winds from the NE & fine weather steering
 at 6 P.M. watch employed in minding the fore sail 2 strong sails in sight & a plenty of pinbacks at 3 P.M. saw a larger bar & boat down we halted towards sunset bent the fore sails at 5 o'clock the barque St Bonchidier capt Rich of Providence 2 weeks out when I went on board at sun down came home latter part of the day moderate breeze & fair weather at 5 A.M. made sail & stood in for the land on bent the fore topmast & by sail & mizzenmast it & bent it again saw the Bonchidier & hummer spruce the big at sundown stood off for the East part of the day so now this day
