 The 2d hours begins with fresh breeze from N.W. & sunny weather
 at 5 P.M. steering to the wind heading from N.W. by N. to N.W. S. watch empty. In ships
 baromet 29.54th duty 1 P.M. exburg. 2 signals with an English ship at 5 P.M. taken
 ship to the N.W. & double reefed topsails equally weather saw the *Pinna*
Pinna bearing N.W. by N. from us at own own observation said middle part of the
 day equally & rainy to shells 10 M. part five hours from ship to south at 5 o'clock
 at 5 o'clock made all sail at 7 o'clock ship to the N.W. saw several sails & one in sailing by
 baromet 29.22th summer breeze white watch empty & in washing & Mending there seen
 the day even fair weather off the South side of *Pinna*

324 Remarks on Tuesday June 15th 1852
Three 2d Hours begin with moderate breeze from the N to E fine weather
at 6 P.M. steering from N E by E to East towards Graciosa watch. empty in ships out at up
barrat 30% the main & main top mast & main 3d yellowed bird steep saw a flock of porpoise
at sun down shorted sail & stand by the wind to N by N Graciosa bearing
E by S latter part of the day thick drizzling weather & shells also at the main sail
at 8 A.M. at 7 o'clock 112 over for Graciosa watch. empty about the ship the day under
barrat 29% on clear off at Graciosa town on bench log we came round by off
there was more ship to the North so we went to the day
