

325 Remarks on Monday June 16th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fine breeze from NW & smooth & some-
at 6 P.M. times weather steering by the wind to the north we finish barque trying
barent 29³⁸ off on at gravisen town saw foraine saw several strong sails at sun
down shoten sail middle part fine weather latter part fresh breeze from
NW & smooth & ruff weather at 2 A.M. we ship & stow in for the land
at 5 made all necessary suit saw several sails 2 whaling barques
at 6 A.M. watch empty in ships duty at 9 tacked off from the land at 11 went
barent 29³⁸ off to sea & saw several small boats to sea foraine & pinbacks
at midnight tacked ship to the NW towards the land so ends this day

326 Remarks on Tuesday June 17th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from NW & smooth weather
at 6 P.M. & wind by shifts steering to the NW in towards the land several sails in
barent 29³⁸ sight one whaling barque finish 2 middle striking gaff topsail & bent
it at 5 tacked ship to the NW at 7 set in to rain shoten sail latter part
of the day light breeze from NW & more calm at 8 made sail & stow
in for gravisen saw 2 whaling barques to the land of us we took
at 6 A.M. up several cask of water out the fore hole & put them in the after hole &
barent 29³⁸ put the light cask in the fore hole saw a plenty of pinbacks the day ends
with light air of wind from the NW & good weather

327 Remarks on Friday June 18th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with light winds from the NW & good weather
at 6 P.M. steering by the wind to the NW in for gravisen watch empty in ships duty
barent 29³⁸ weather down the after hole 2 whaling barques in sight at 6 P.M. when
the barque Mission & George & New-hope 19 days out then I went on board
& got letters & papers & heard from home by Mr Carter at our down shoten sail
at 10 came on board & steering to the north by the wind middle & latter part
of the day fresh breeze from NW to NW & smooth & ruff weather at 6 A.M.
at 6 A.M. we ship in for the land & set gaff & shothar watch empty in washing
barent 29³⁸ then down at 9 tacked off from the land at 2 past 11 tacked in gaff & shothar
so ends this day ruff weather

328 Remarks on Saturday June 19th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from NW & ruff & smooth weather
at 6 P.M. steering to the NW & the main double reef topsails watch empty in washing then down
barent 29³⁸ barque in sight off our lee bow steering the same at 8 P.M. finish for topsail
& last reefed the main latter part of the day fine breeze & smooth weather at 2 A.M. we
at 6 A.M. ship to the NW at 8 made all sail watch empty about the ships rigging at 11 tacked
barent 29³⁸ to the windward of the barque in sight on our lee bow at midnight tacked ship to the
NW off from gravisen so ends this day

329 Remarks on Sunday June 20th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from the westward & smooth weather
at 6 P.M. steering to the NW by the wind watch empty in ships duty & open getting out
barent 29³⁸ plank to stop up the hole in the cabin bulkhead the barque in sight off our lee
bow steering the same at 8 P.M. we reefed the topsails strong breeze & ruff & smooth
at 6 A.M. at 7 tacked in gaff shothar & for topsail latter part of the day more moderate & thick
barent 29³⁸ smooth weather at 6 A.M. we ship to the NW & made sail at 9 set across
topgallant sail saw one pinback the day ends smooth weather

330 Remarks on Monday June 21st 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from about west & thick smooth
at 6 P.M. weather steering to the NW by the wind at 2 P.M. tacked ship to the NW at 6
barent 29³⁸ landed the boat & went to a piece of timber after fish but found none came on
board at sun down shoten sail latter part of the day fresh breeze & smooth
weather at 2 A.M. we ship to the NW at 8 made sail saw several sails in sight
at 6 A.M. breeze steering to the eastward watch empty about the ship Mr Manchester making
barent 29³⁸ a signal for the ship & past 11 saw fogel took in main sail 3rd galledant
double reefed for topsail at midnight tacked ship to the NW & set in to fog

331 Remarks on Tuesday June 22nd 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fresh breeze from the westward & thick smooth
at 6 P.M. weather steering by the wind to the NW watch empty about the ship Mr Manchester
barent 29³⁸ making a signal for the ship fogel in sight saw pinbacks at 3 P.M. tacked
ship & stow in for the land barque in sight in sight at 4 past 6 tacked
off from the land at sun down shoten sail at 8 the wind shifted to the
NW & latter part of the day fine breeze from the NW & good weather at 6 A.M. made
barent 29³⁸ sail & stow to the NW bound in to fogel several sails in sight at 8 past 11 tacked
bound the Westward look & went on shore after our provisions so ends this day
fine weather lying at anchor
