Three 24 Hours begins with fine weather being of 4 on at 10 AM meeting
at 5 PM in company with barque Mercator & hij 8 Anderson & 8 vessels lying to
barment 29³⁸/₁₀₀ under one of them antartic of Provincetown capt snow 180 lbs repairing
had been run in the 5 of last ship & cut down on one side at 10 PM
I came on board calm at 11 A light breeze sprung up
Latter part of the day calm several sails in sight at 5 A.M. called all
at 6 AM hands & commenced stowing down our chains spoke with the barque anneau
barment 29³⁸/₁₀₀ left little of New bed for 13 month 300 lbs at 9 A.M. I went on
board of the barque Mercator & spent the day light breeze from the 8 AM

at 6 PM stowing by the wind to the NW the morning with the Mercator at sun down
barment 29³⁸/₁₀₀ was shotted sail at 4 past 8 PM I came on board from the Mercator
she is bound up to 2 hours at 9 PM fogal bore by compass 2 AM
at 10 AM in fine breeze equally by shells latter part of the day fresh breeze
at 6 AM from NW to south equally & rain by shells at 5 AM made sail 3 sails
barment 29³⁸/₁₀₀ in sight whaler watch employed in ship duty looking up our net to put our
onions in at 11. tacked ship to the westward the day was good weather
made all sail so once this day

at 6 PM under all sail stowing by the wind to the westward watch employed in ship duty

hij 8 Anderson & Mercator in sight at sun down shotted sail at 9 AM
calm latter part of the day light breeze from the NW & good weather at 5 AM
made sail watch employed in working then down 2 sails in sight sun two
at 6 AM in sight last night at 9 AM the wind beared up from the NW to made

day fine breeze from NW to SE & smoky weather at 5 AM were ship to

barment 29³⁸/₁₀₀ at sun down shotted sail latter part of the day fine breeze from NW to SE
at 12 noon ship to the NW at 5 AM made sail watch employed about the
ship various kinds of work at 11 AM tacked ship & stood in for flocks
at 6 AM braced up high NW & whaling barque in sight the day was fine breeze
barment 29³⁸/₁₀₀ stowing in for flocks between 10 AM & 11 AM
left in 7 AM 39.28 AM long in 7 chronometer 31.03 best

338 Remarks on Tuesday June 29th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from NW to SE & smoky
at 6 PM weather watch employed in ship duty & whaling barque in sight at 1 past
barment 29³⁸/₁₀₀ 1 tacked ship to the eastward at 2 PM the breeze bore by compass NW to SE
at 6 AM distant at sun down shotted sail at 12 noon ship to the NW latter part
of the day light breeze from the NW & fine weather at 5 AM made sail several sails
at 6 AM in sight on land the flying jills & sparrows & various birds at 4 AM watch put the
barment 29³⁸/₁₀₀ before the day was the same
left in 7 AM 39.30 AM long in 7 chronometer
