Three 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from NNE & fine weather
at 6 P.M. starting at 10 M watch employed in ship's duty fitted the cutting block
B.R. 29³⁸ 1/2 of 1/2 I will do a new line at 3 P.M. stand 1 P.M. at 4 saw a strong
bait leaving 11 E at sun down the wind to the Eastward saw a whole ship's station laid off our bow
starting to the Eastward by the wind's middle & latter part of the day
moderate breeze & fine weather at 5 A.M. made sail the strong

374 Remarks on Wednesday August 4th 1852

at 6 P.M. smooth weather starting South at 1 P.M. found the two last
B.R. 29³⁸ 1/2 boats after black fish & got one small one to the last boat
at 5 P.M. saw 2 Merchant bargues starting to the NNE at sun down
the wind to the NNE the middle part raining
by 1 P.M. latter part more fair with fine breeze from NNE at 4 A.M. made
sail one merchant barge in sight at 7 A.M. turned up the wait
boat & sailed her bottom at 8 A.M. raised up a whaling barge leaving
at 6 A.M. 11 M was then by the wind to the Eastward & at all sail watch employed in
B.R. 29³⁸ 1/2 minding our black fish blubber the day was with fresh breeze & flying clouds
& flying clouds of rain & spitting rain the wait boat & the blubber

375 Remarks on Thursday August 5th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from NNE & flying squalls of rain
at 6 P.M. starting by the wind to the Eastward watch employed in ship's duty one merchant
B.R. 29³⁸ 1/2 barge & one whaling barge in sight at 3 began to be squally at 4 double
up the topsails at sun down the wind to the Eastward latter part of the day squally
by 1 P.M. at 5 A.M. was ship to the NNE & made sail at 7 Tackled to the East
at 8 A.M. was at 9 Tackled to the NNE watch employed in ship's duty about the ship
B.R. 29³⁸ 1/2 the day was fair weather
Left in by 35-22 at long in by Chronometer 23-25 West

376 Remarks on Friday August 6th 1852

at 6 P.M. by the wind to the NNE watch employed in ship's duty I will do one line &

latter part of the day some flying rain squalls at 8 A.M. made sail
watch employed in washing three down at 7 Tackled to the NNE at 8 Tackled
at 6 A.M. to the NNE at 9 made sail the day was fair weather
B.R. 29³⁸ 1/2 Left in by 35-31 at long in by Chronometer 24-30 West

377 Remarks on Saturday August 7th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with fine breeze from NNE & flying clouds
at 6 P.M. starting by the wind to the NNE watch employed in washing three down
B.R. 29³⁸ 1/2 at 3 P.M. made a fire & boiled out our black fish blubber at 4 past 3 saw a
Whale carcass at 4 saw a Black bearing ship from at 4 past 3 heard a
boat & went on board of her it was an American Eastern built brig laden
with lumber for boxes with her main mast standing & main yard hanging
by the rings & the stern anchor hanging over board 2 fathoms under water &
the chain over board through the bulwarks by the fine chains & the brig full of
water her rising all gone & her fore mast cut off above the deck we caught
a good lot of fish away & got out some iron bolts shackles & thimbles of work
at 6 A.M. came on board the wind to the NNE latter part of the day moderate breeze
B.R. 29³⁸ 1/2 ran all at 3 A.M. was ship to the Eastward at 5 made sail the black in
light to the land at 7 Tackled to the NNE at 9 went on board of her & caught
some fish & got out some iron bolts thimbles & lumber cut off her chain & let
the anchor & chain go & the rigging up forward was on board the wind to
at 8 A.M. left her at 8 past 11 A.M. came on board made sail & Tackled to the NNE & ran
from NNE fine weather & at good breeze so much this day
Left in by 35-22 at long in by Chronometer 25-07 West

378 Remarks on Sunday August 8th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from NNE & fine weather under all
at 6 P.M. sail starting to the NNE by the wind watch employed in cleaning off the old iron
B.R. 29³⁸ 1/2 & having fish at 2 P.M. last sight of the Black bearing ship from us at 5
saw one fish back back to the ship for him at sun down the wind to the NNE
was ship to the NNE middle & latter part of the day fresh breeze from NNE
at 6 A.M. & flying rain squalls & smoky weather at 6 A.M. at 7 Tackled to the NNE
B.R. 29³⁸ 1/2 took them in the day was more fair
