lower going to the East at 3 o'clock for him & got past the last boat

BR 30 2/10 3 watches got all the whole on board but the rest & we 10 o'clock at sun down
Graciosa bar Mr. B. & Graciosa bar 11 o'clock latter part of the day light winds from
at 6 A.M. NW to NW fine weather at 5 o'clock called all hands & looked on to our whale care
BR 29 2/10 & built it were ship & made sail heads from the water to the water at 10 o'clock
A fine & commenced boiling head the day once fine weather

390 Remarks on Friday August 20th 1852
