

1108 Remarks on Tuesday September 7th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from NE & fair weather
at 6 P.M. off St George steering over for fogal watch Employed in ship duty
B.R. 29²⁴ one whaling barge off our lee bow steering the same as we took
in main top gallant sail at 4 took in main sail & kept the strong
breeze on the opposite tack which was the barge charr of our barge
middle part of the day strong winds thick rain & squally weather
at 6 A.M. attended with thunder & lightning sailing back & forth between
B.R. 29²⁴ p.m. & St George latter part more moderate but thick &
raining one barge in sight the day more morose

1109 Remarks on Wednesday September 8th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze by squalls from SSE to S.W.
at 6 P.M. & blowing squalls sailing back & forth between p.m. & St George
B.R. 29²⁴ p.m. Easy sail in company with a strong barge & 5 men sailing
this strong breeze & on at fogal harbour at 2 P.M. the wind began to calm & weather
was the
last night
of our barge
middle part fresh breeze from about West latter part fine breeze &
fine weather & plenty of whales in sight at 6 A.M. Sun on horizon
breeze to the land winded whales & bound our boats were made sore
& then for him & then bound our boats & the strong breeze boats
thick & killed a whale & our boats & the barge Hiram's boats
at 6 A.M. of our barge charr them up at long fogal dirt in their but
B.R. 29²⁴ could not come up with them got up the charr & went on board
of the barge at four moments she was 8 or 9 days out of date at 11
came on board & went to beating to windward up in the fogal passage
with a fine breeze so once this day fair weather

1110 Remarks on Thursday September 9th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from S.W. to S.E. &
at 6 P.M. fine weather under all sail beating up in the fogal passage
B.R. 29²⁴ at plenty of vessels sailing off & on in the passage & at plenty to the land
of fogal at 5 P.M. the R.L. Doctor John of Mattheisett bound
out of the passage 200 lbs middle & latter part of the day moderate
at 6 A.M. breeze & fine weather sailing off & on at fogal recruiting at 8
B.R. 29²⁴ A.M. I went on board there with a boat crew the day ends
with fine weather

1111 Remarks on Friday September 10th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from NE to E & fine weather
at 6 P.M. Sailing off & on at fogal recruiting in company with 2 ships & 2 barges
B.R. 29²⁴ & 2 barge at sun down I came on board got all our recruits & 3 tons
of Patent fuel & then out of the passage bound over the floor double
repacked the tobacco & stored 3 watches fresh bears at 9 stevedore in
middle part of the day fresh breeze latter part moderate breeze from West
at 6 A.M. & breezy weather at 8 made sail steering by the wind to the ship to watch
B.R. 29²⁴ Employed in hanging up pumpkins & cabbage & storing away our
Patent fuel in the sun saw 2 barges the day ends moderate winds
left in 204 39.12 at long in by chronometer 29.12 west

1112 Remarks on Saturday September 11th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with moderate winds from about West &
at 6 P.M. breezy weather steering by the wind to the ship to watch Employed in
B.R. 29²⁴ ships duty finished storing off our Patent fuel & washed of the decks
& other various kinds of work on board at sun down stevedore
middle & latter part of the day moderate breeze & thick weather & some showers
at 6 A.M. of rain at 12 were ship to the S.W. at 5 made sail watch Employed in
B.R. 29²⁴ washing there here at 8 tucked ship to the ship to the day ends light winds
left in 204 39.35 at long in by chronometer 30.10 west

1113 Remarks on Sunday September 12th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with light winds from the westward & breezy
at 6 P.M. weather steering to the north by the wind watch Employed in washing there
B.R. 29²⁴ here at sun down stevedore sail middle & latter part of the day light winds
& breezy weather at 12 were ship to the S.W. at 5 made all sail &
at 6 A.M. strong sail in sight steering to the Eastward saw grampus the day ends
B.R. 29²⁴ with good weather tucked ship to the north
left in 204 39.34 at long in by chronometer 30.10 west

1114 Remarks on Monday September 13th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from NE to E & breezy
at 6 P.M. weather steering to the north by the wind at sun down stevedore
B.R. 29²⁴ day thick weather & some rain at 5 made sail & broke out the fore sail & got
out floor & head & stored the watch Employed in enlarging our cabin with our own
at 6 A.M. merchant barge the day ends strong breeze double re-packed the tobacco
B.R. 29²⁴ left in 204 39.52 at
