

1115 Remarks on Tuesday September 14th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from NW & thick weather
at 6 PM by 400 fathoms standing to the westward by the wind under double reef to 500 fms
BR 29 1/2 fms. & 1/2 fms. watch employed in enlarging our vision with
the Island Corvo & Flores in sight at 4 PM tacked ship at 7 PM
the barque Vigilant capt De la Cruz of New Bedford spoke us 22
months out clean latter part of the day fresh breeze & thick weather
at 6 AM & ruggid sea on at 5 PM tacked ship & hauled in for fms
BR 29 1/2 fms broke out & got out 100 fms & hauled to let up to put water in
sea some whales the day ends setting up 100 fms at 10

1116 Remarks Wednesday September 15th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from SE & thick weather
at 6 PM & ruggid sea on standing by the wind to the westward. Hauling in
BR 29 1/2 fms for 100 fms watch employed in hauling out the main hatch way
for water cask & the cooper employed in flaying off new sharks
several sails laying off & on at 6 PM spoke with the brig
Esther capt Hopkins of Orleans 24 months out clean tacking off on
at 10 AM made port strong breeze from SE & thick weather ruggid
sea on attended with lightning & some thunder at 9 PM tacked
at 6 AM off from fms to the eastward & carried sail to fetch by Corvo
BR 29 1/2 fms at 2 PM the wind began to moderate at 3 PM tacked ship to the SE
at 7 PM tacked for fms some squally some lightning & some thunder
the day ends the same fms & Corvo in sight

1117 Remarks on Thursday September 16th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with moderate wind from SE & thick
at 6 PM weather from NW to SE attended with thunder & lightning by 400
BR 29 1/2 fms at 1 PM tacked NW to the SE part of fms bearing NW from us &
Corvo in sight at 1 PM tacked NW to the SE part of fms bearing NW from us &
it commenced lightning & the wind began to shift to the westward
middle part strong breeze by 400 fms & clear laying off & on at fms at 2 PM
at 6 AM the wind began to blow from SE & moderate sail & began to
BR 29 1/2 fms beat to the windward for 100 fms several barques & brigs in sight
the brig Esther spoke to theeward of us the day ends with strong breeze from
SE & heavy swell on at the hour of 10 AM

1118 Remarks on Friday September 17th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with strong breeze from SE & heavy swell on

1119 Remarks on Saturday September 18th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from SE & fair weather
at 6 PM the wind & sea moderating down bearing to the SE & under all new fms
BR 29 1/2 fms sail fms island bearing SE by compass middle & latter part of the day
fresh breeze & fine weather overhauled but a heavy swell rolling from SE
at 11 PM tacked ship to the SE at 6 AM got all sail on her at 7 AM
A squall took in the light sails one barque off our lee quarter standing in for
at 6 AM the land cooper employed in shoring up the waist boat put two new sharks
BR 29 1/2 fms in bar at 11 AM saw 6 whales the day ends fine weather but ruggid sea on

1120 Remarks on Sunday September 19th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from SE & fine weather & a
at 6 PM heavy swell bearing from SE watch employed in ships duty cooper mending
BR 29 1/2 fms the waist boat & whales in sight at 1 PM tacked off from the land at
sun down shut down sail light wind moderate & latter part of the day light
at 6 AM wind & fine weather at 5 AM were ship to the wind under barque & brigs
BR 29 1/2 fms at 10 AM two sails off to the leeward the day ends light wind
standing in for 100 fms
