

420 Remarks on Monday September 27<sup>th</sup> 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fine breeze from N.E. & peaking at 8 P.M. showers of rain by spells steering by the wind to the south gradually at 2 P.M. our lee bow at sun down station sail & was ship to the N.E. wind & latter part of the day fresh breeze from the Eastward & peaking at 5 A.M. made rain & steered to the South watch employed in ship duty saw 3 strong sails 2 of them whole at midnoon on green trees here at 6 A.M. we by compass 6 miles distant so near this day  
 B.P. 29<sup>th</sup> Left in 7 04 3 38 1/2 long in 4 chronometer 27.20 west

429 Remarks on Tuesday September 28<sup>th</sup> 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from the Eastward & peaking at 5 P.M. unusual much heavy rain steering S.W. bound to the Main ground watch B.P. 30<sup>th</sup> Employed in ship duty one whaling lug off our lee beam steering the same at sun down received bore N.W. to from us stood whole watches steering S.W. with a fine breeze latter part of the day moderate breeze & wind peaking showers of rain at 4 past 4 P.M. S.W. at 6 A.M. at Mary Island bore E.S. from us & we saw 11 whalers commenced rattling the S.W. watch employed in ship duty & being down the Main rigging the day new with light winds & cloudy weather  
 Left in 7 04 36.39 1/2 long in 4

430 Remarks on Wednesday September 29<sup>th</sup> 1852

There 24 Hours begins with light winds from about East & changing weather steering by the wind to the N.E. watch employed in rattling the main & being the Main rigging at 5 P.M. finished rattling the lower main shrouds & taring the Main rigging at sun down at Mary Island bore 8 A.M. station sail & stood 3 watches middle part of the day light winds at 2 A.M. the wind hauled to the N.W. then to the N.E. at 5 A.M. made sail & commenced rattling the starboard Main shrouds & taring the rigging round at Mary Island bore 8 A.M. saw one large steam boat steering to the Eastward at 9 the wind began to blow on from N.W. & hauled to the S.W. at midnoon double reefed the Asperis so near this day cloudy weather & at fresh breeze from the

431 Remarks on Thursday September 30<sup>th</sup> 1852

There 24 Hours begins with strong breeze from the N.W. & steering by the wind to the N.E. watch employed in rattling & taring rigging at 4 P.M. finished the starboard Main shrouds & work in the fore & Main at sun down double reefed the topsails & took the boats up on upper canvas from 9 P.M. to 11 A.M. strong winds & heavy squalls of wind & rain at the wind hauled at 6 A.M. began to moderate at 11 A.M. stand S.W. & made sail watch employed in washing there down the day new with light winds from the N.W. & fair weather  
 Left in 7 04 35.55 1/2 long in 4 chronometer 24.18 west

432 Remarks on Friday October 1<sup>st</sup> 1852

There 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from the N.W. & fair weather steering S.W. watch employed in washing there down the day new at sun down station sail & left to the Eastward by the wind at 9 stand S.W. the wind began to hauled to the N.W. & latter part of the day fresh breeze from the N.W. & some peaking squalls at 4 A.M. made sail & stand from South to N.W. watch employed in taring & rattling the rigging, saw two strong sails steering to the N.W. the day new fine breeze & some showery steam S.W.  
 Left in 7 04 35.08 1/2 long in 4 chronometer 23.30 west

433 Remarks on Saturday October 2<sup>nd</sup> 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fresh breeze from about E. & N.E. steering S.W. watch employed in rattling & taring the rigging one strong sail in sight steering to the N.W. at sun down station sail & latter part of the day moderate breeze & variable & squally & raining by spells at 5 A.M. 1st whole topsails at 8 took ship to the N.W. & wind from S.W. saw one strong sail at midnoon took ship to the N.W. so near this day moderate  
 Left in 7 04 34.25 1/2 long in 4 chronometer 23.10 west

434 Remarks on Sunday October 3<sup>rd</sup> 1852

There 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze & variable steering to the N.W. at 4 past 1 P.M. the wind hauled to the N.W. & made sail at 5 P.M. at sun down station sail & stand S.W. 1st whole & latter part of the day fine breeze from N.W. & fine weather at 4 A.M. made sail saw one whaling barque steering to the N.W. & one merchant lug at 7 stand South at 11 saw 2 more strong sails the day new fine weather stand S.W.  
 Left in 7 04 33.49 1/2 long in 4 chronometer 22.20 west
