 day moderate breeze from East & some thunder & lightning &
 some spitting rain especially at 7 A.M. steam 1 B.E. the day in use
 at 6 A.M. with 1 signal just paid over

 There 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from East &
 at 6 P.M. good weather steering S.E. watch Employed in ship duty
 B.R. 29¹⁸ various kinds of work, macle & latter part of the day light winds
 from SE to SSE & calm at 7 A.M. saw a strong sail steering to the
 westward at 10 the board of boat & came on board after sunset
 at 6 A.M. to find it was a French ship from Quebec bound to Nantes
 B.R. 29¹⁸ However this day in use with moderate breeze from SE & fine weather
 Lett in by 02 13 at long in by chronometer 20.05 west

466 Remarks on Thursday November 4th 1852
 There 24 Hours begins with light winds from SSE to South &
 at 6 P.M. fine weather under all sail steering by the wind heading from
 B.R. 29¹⁸ W to NW watch Employed about the ship macle & latter part
 of the day fine breeze from SE to SSE steering by the wind heading from
 1 W to 1 N some spitting squalls saw 2 Spanish at morning
 at 6 A.M. bound to the westward boat for black fish so much this day
 B.R. 29¹⁸ Lett in by 02 54 at long in by chronometer 20.50 west

467 Remarks on Friday November 5th 1852
 There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from SSE & spitting
 at 6 P.M. down the lastward boat off other black fish to before 1 P.M. the crew
 B.R. 29¹⁸ on board without sun up steam to the NW by the wind at 7 P.M. we
 took a heavy squall of wind & rain it was a tempest took in some
 wind from East at 9 more moderate breeze with the wind heading to the
 at 6 A.M. South latter part of the day light winds from the South & calm & equally by
 B.R. 29¹⁸ shells steering by the wind heading from NW to NE the day in use
 Lett in by 02 44 at long in by chronometer 21.32 west

468 Remarks on Saturday November 6th 1852
 There 24 Hours begins with light winds from South to NW calm &
 at 6 P.M. equally & rainy by spells at 2 A.M. set in to rain but the wind all round
 B.R. 29¹⁸ the compass & calm at 5 P.M. Tackled ship to the SE at 10 Tackled ship &
 headed NW latter part of the day fine breeze & cloudy weather at 11 A.M.
 Tackled ship & headed from SE to SE saw 2 Spanish & one strong sail
 at 6 A.M. off our lee beam watch Employed in ship duty at morning Tackled ship
 B.R. 29¹⁸ & headed up NW with a fine breeze so much this day
 Lett in by 02 44 at long in by chronometer 21.25 west

469 Remarks on Sunday November 7th 1852
 There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from about South & passing
 at 6 P.M. down steering by the wind heading NW to NW watch Employed in ship
 B.R. 29¹⁸ duty at 1 P.M. saw 2 strong sails one to point of our lee bow & one off our lee
 beam one of them was a whaling larger macle & latter part of the day
 fine breeze & fine weather steering by the wind heading from NW to NW
 at 6 A.M. to NW at 7 A.M. saw one big off our weather beam steering to the E
 by the wind & one larger off our lee beam steering the same at 8 A.M. Tackled
 B.R. 29¹⁸ ship to the NW the day in use with a fine breeze & fine weather
 Lett in by 02 30 at long in by chronometer 22.15 west

470 Remarks on Monday November 8th 1852
 There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from about SE to South
 at 6 P.M. & spitting down under all sail steering by the wind heading from NW to NW
 B.R. 29¹⁸ 1 W to 1 N 2 strong sails in sight off our lee quarter steering to the SE
 one of our weather bow steering to the Eastward at 2 P.M. Tackled ship to
 the SE macle & latter part of the day fine breeze from South to SE steering
 by the wind heading from NW to NW at 6 A.M. on board the fore
 at 6 A.M. top sail & boat & crew one & commenced repairing the old one
 B.R. 29¹⁸ so much this day 2 strong sails off our weather quarter steering to the SE
 Lett in by 02 02 at long in by chronometer 24.00 west

471 Remarks on Tuesday November 9th 1852
 There 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from about South & spitting
 at 6 P.M. steering by the wind heading NW to NW watch Employed in mousing the old fore
 B.R. 29¹⁸ to suit 2 strong sails in sight off our weather quarter macle & latter part of the
 at 6 A.M. day moderate breeze from NW to NE watch Employed in mousing for tobacco
 B.R. 29¹⁸ at noon finished it so much this day fine weather heading NW to NW

 B.R. 29¹⁸
