There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from ESE & mostly
at 6 PM weather clearing 12.30 watch employed in stowing off the after hold
BR 29²² at 4 past 5 spoke the Borgue has fore-capt. Spooner came on board
11.50 at sun down shot and sail at 9 capt. Spooner went on board &
we both stand to the ESE by the wind at 8 past 2 at which we were
ship to the NW at 5 made sail saw one sail off our bow stern
to the NE watch employed in ship duty at 11 saw 2 whales bearing

1182 Remarks on Saturday November 20th 1852

at 6 PM steering by the wind to the NW watch employed in washing the deck
BR 29²² saw a school of porpoise at sun down shot and sail & were ship to the
NE made & set part of the day fine breeze & passing clouds at 5
AM was ship to the NW & made sail at 9 AM the George &
Mary capt. Manchester spoke us & I went on board & we both stand
at 6 AM to the NW at midnight on tack ship to the NE so ended this day
BR 29²² left in 7.04 16.41 South Long in 7 chronometer 36.28 west

1183 Remarks on Sunday November 21st 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze & passing clouds steering
at 6 PM by the wind to the NE galling with the George & Mary at 3 PM saw
BR 29²² the Borgue Janett ship to the land at sun down capt. Manchester
came on board of here we shot and sail at 9 capt. Manchester went
at 6 AM on board latter part of the day fine weather at 5 AM was ship to the NW &
BR 29²² made sail saw 3 whales at midnight on tack ship to the NE ended this day
left in 7.04 18.14 South Long in 7 chronometer 36.00 west

1184 Remarks on Tuesday November 22nd 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze & fine weather under all sail steering
at 6 PM by the wind to the NE the Borgue Janett ship to the land & we at sun
BR 29²² down shot and sail latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather
at 5 AM made sail & then both saw several sails watch employed
in ship duty shot over our potatoes & other various kinds of work
at 6 AM the day ends fine weather breeze to the windward steering for us
BR 29²² left in 7.04 17.10 South Long in 7 chronometer 36.08 west

1185 Remarks on Tuesday November 23rd 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze & fine weather steering by
at 6 PM the wind to the NW at 2 PM the Borgue Janett ship left wing
BR 29²² spoke us I went on board at sun down shot and sail capt. wing
came on board at 4 past 9 PM he went on board & we stand
by the wind to the NE latter part of the day fresh breeze & passing
squalls at 5 AM made sail & stand both saw 3 whales George &
at 6 AM Mary sea port P Franklin at 9 AM spoke the D Franklin capt
BR 29²² Gifford came on board & we both stand to the NE by the wind
the day ends fresh breeze left in 7.04 17.11 South Long in 7 chronometer 36.20

1186 Remarks on Wednesday November 24th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze & passing squalls steering
at 6 PM by the wind to the NE galling with the D Franklin at 6 PM capt
BR 29²² Gifford came on board & we both stood to the NW under
double reef topsails at 9 took in the fore topsail made & set part of
the day strong breeze & ruggid & some passing squalls at 5 AM was ship
at 6 AM to the NE & made some sail several sails in sight at midnight were
BR 29²² ship to the NW so ended this day strong breeze
left in 7.04 17.10 South Long in 7 chronometer 36.05 west

1187 Remarks on Thursday November 25th 1852

There 24 hours begins with strong breeze & ruggid sea on steering by the wind
at 6 PM to the NW watch employed in picking up at 1 PM the Borgue Janett of
BR 29²² without spoke us to the windward steering to the NW saw the Mattapoisett
at sun down took in the fore latter part of the day fresh breeze at 5 AM was
at 6 AM ship to the NE & made sail saw several sails Mattapoisett off our weather
BR 29²² quarter steering the same at 10 we stood 11 PM the day ends with four whales
in sight left in 7.04 17.20 South Long in 7 chronometer 36.06 west
