

1195 Remarks on Friday December 3rd 1852

There 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from N.E. & smooth weather steering N.W. watch Employed in ship duty saw on water at 6 P.M. B.R. 29 2/40 Briz steering by the wind to the N.E. no top gallant sails out at 1 went out of sight at sun down shot down sail & stem by the wind to the N.E. at 12 were ship to the N.W. the part of the day fine breeze from N.E. & cloudy & thick smoky weather & still at 5 A.M. made sail at 6 A.M. & stem N.W. watch Employed in ship duty the ship arrived at 11 stem N.W. the day ends cloudy & smoky weather
Set in by account 28.10 South Long in by chronometer 42.34 west

1196 Remarks on Saturday December 4th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fine breeze from N.E. & cloudy & smoky weather steering N.W. watch Employed in ship duty saw on water at 6 P.M. B.R. 29 2/40 five top gallant sails & four royal yards at 11 P.M. saw 2 strong sails stem by the wind to the Eastward & one of them steering to the N.W. at sun down shot down sail & stem by the wind to the Eastward at 1 A.M. were ship to the N.W. at 5 made sail & stem N.W. at 6 began to rain at 7 double reefed topsails at 8 A.M. it began to clear & at 9 watch Employed in washing & mending the sails at 9 turned the sails out & let main top gallant sail set to wind & after that the day ends moderate breeze & cloudy & smoky weather Long 43.20 west
Set in by 27.20 South Long in by chronometer more to day 43.30 west

1197 Remarks on Sunday December 5th 1852

There 24 hours begins with light winds from N.E. & cloudy & smoky weather steering N.W. watch Employed in washing & mending the sails at 7 P.M. took in sail to last reef topsails & luffed to the wind to the Eastward equally & reeling by shells attended with thunder & lightning from 12 to 1 A.M. heavy rains & equally weather at 5 A.M. up some at double reef topsails & stem N.W. wind from North & thick weather the day ends with thick weather
Set in by account 28.20 South Long in by 43.48 west

1198 Remarks on Monday December 6th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from North & thick weather & raining under double reef topsails & fore sail steering N.W. at 2 A.M. up some at 5 fair weather the wind bellied round to E. & ran down took in fore topsail much calm through the night at 5 A.M. set all sail & stem N.W. by 1 with a fine breeze & thick weather watch Employed about the ship at 10 pleasant weather & moderate breeze & smooth sea & calm. A part of the waterway seen over mi. birth saw grass & grass the day ends light winds & pleasant weather
Set in by 29.09 South Long in by chronometer 44.50 west

1199 Remarks on Tuesday December 7th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with light breeze from N.E. & fine weather & at 6 P.M. smooth sea steering N.W. watch Employed in ship duty at 2 P.M. saw a strong sail bearing 11 hr from us ship found to be a longue steering to the N.E. & at sun down shot down sail middle & latter part of the day light winds from E.S.E. to N.E. & fine pleasant weather at 5 A.M. made sail & stem N.W. watch Employed in ship duty set out over our potatoes & fruit the main royal shroues to the mast head & cap. the main shroues saw grass & grass the day ends fine smooth weather
Set in by 29.23 South Long in by chronometer 45.20 west

500 Remarks on Wednesday December 8th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with light winds from N.E. & fine pleasant weather & a smooth sea steering N.W. watch Employed about the ship at 2 P.M. set 2 P.M. stem N.W. at sun down shot down sail & stem by the wind to the N.E. middle & latter part of the day moderate breeze from N.E. & fine weather at 5 A.M. made all sail & stem N.W. watch Employed in ship duty put on back cloth into our old fore staysail at 10 stem N.W. saw on big steering to the N.W. & saw grass & grass the day fine weather
Set in by 30.28 South Long in by chronometer 46.50 west

501 Remarks on Thursday December 9th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with light winds from the N.E. & fine weather steering N.W. watch Employed in ship duty our old staysail one began to fly at midnight shot down sail & stem by the wind to the N.W. the part of the day fine breeze from E.S.E. & fair weather at 5 A.M. made all sail & stem South saw grass & grass watch Employed about the ship got out bread & fruit the day Set in by 31.21 South Long in by chronometer 48.33 west
