There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from ESE & fine weather.
 at 6 P.M. under all sail steering south watch Employed in cleaning the rest of the
 B.R. 29th 1852 in on work outside & inside of the ship at 5 o'clock plenty of porpoise at
 sun down shoten sail little part of the day fine breeze from the
 more & cloudy weather at 5 o'clock made sail & steam from south to
 at 6 A.M. 11 M watch Employed in washing & mending there done at 10 o'clock
 B.R. 29th 1852 Mast at 11 o'clock at 12 o'clock & around the mast the day ends
 with a fresh breeze falling in by 6 32.30 south long in by chronometer 47.15 west

503 Remarks on Saturday December 11th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a fresh breeze from north & cloudy weather
 at 6 P.M. sun out by 8 o'clock steering West watch Employed in washing & mending
 B.R. 29th 1852 there done at 1 P.M. saw a strong sail off our lee beam at 3 the wind
 began to shift to the westward & began on at sun down shoten sail & were
 ship to the south at 2 o'clock was ship to the south latter part of the day
 strong breeze from NW with NW & falling squalls at 8 past 11 o'clock saw
 at 6 A.M. to the windward one blue mermaid & long standing to the west
 B.R. 29th 1852 under short sail the day ends with moderate gale from NW
 left in by 6 32.50 south long in by chronometer 47.42 west

504 Remarks on Sunday December 12th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with moderate gale from NW & falling
 at 6 P.M. squalls blowing to the NE under short sail & main spruce
 B.R. 29th 1852 for the mast stayed at 2 P.M. began to moderate latter part of the day
 light winds from West & pleasant weather at 5 A.M. were ship to the NW
 & made all sail one long standing near to us at 11 to the ship & began
 at 6 A.M. 11 M the day ends pleasant weather
 B.R. 29th 1852 left in by 6 32.54 south long in by chronometer 47.20 west

505 Remarks on Monday December 13th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with light winds from West & pleasant weather
 at 6 P.M. steering by the wind to the N from long standing sight at sun down shoten
 B.R. 29th 1852 sail many colors latter part of the day moderate breeze from NW
 & fine weather at 5 o'clock made sail & steam NW on last main Bet
 at 6 A.M. Gallons & commenced repairing it at 10 o'clock saw two whaling
 B.R. 29th 1852 to the windward steering to the Eastward the day ends fine weather
 left in by 6 33.29 south long in by chronometer 47.48 west

506 Remarks on Tuesday December 14th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with a moderate breeze from NW & fine weather
 at 6 P.M. steering 1 M watch Employed in mending the main & fore sail at 3
 B.R. 29th 1852 P.M. finished it & bent it steam NW & at sun down shoten sail & steam
 by the wind to the ESE made & latter part of the day strong breeze from NW
 & a rugged sea on & the weather at 5 A.M. were ship to the westward & at 1
 out fore top sail & shot up the main at 7 o'clock in the fore sail at 9 o'clock
 at 6 A.M. A gun saw several turtles the day ends strong breeze & much weather
 B.R. 29th 1852 left in by 6 33.54 south long in by chronometer 47.50 west

507 Remarks on Wednesday December 15th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from NW & rugged & cloudy
 at 6 P.M. overcast weather steering by the wind to the westward under short sail at
 B.R. 29th 1852 3 P.M. began to moderate & went to the westward saw porpoise & at 4 o'clock
 under short sail in the fore sail at 12 o'clock was ship to the south at 2 P.M. the wind
 the fore watch below out south & commenced thundering & sharp lightning to the NW
 at 4 past 11 o'clock was ship to the south at heavy squalls of wind from the south & then
 at 6 A.M. with heavy thunder & sharp lightning & large hail stones close up
 B.R. 29th 1852 both fore & main at 8 o'clock made sail & steam by the wind
 at 6 A.M. to the NW saw one merchant ship steering ESE & one man strong
 B.R. 29th 1852 sail to the windward steering the same at 9 o'clock saw a strong whaling
 barque off our lee bow steering to the south at 8 past 11 o'clock saw one turtle
 & some the day fine weather left in by 6 34.02 south long in by chronometer 48.47

508 Remarks on Thursday December 16th 1852

There 24 Hours begins with light winds from south & fine weather
 at 6 P.M. steering by the wind to the NW one whaling barque off our lee beam
 B.R. 29th 1852 steering the same watch Employed about the ship the wind falling wind to
 the NW at sun down shoten sail latter part of the day fine breeze from
 NW & blowing to the NW at 5 A.M. made sail & steam by the wind to the
 south watch Employed about the ship at 10 o'clock saw two whaling
 barques to the leeward ship with each other one of them was bottling
 at 6 A.M. out of whale & I found to be the Atlantic at Morrisum in fact
 B.R. 29th 1852 ship & began to steam from NW & on this day
 left in by 6 34.58 south long in by chronometer 48.50 west
