fresh breeze from North & fine weather at 5 A.M. made sail & stem by the wind
at 6 A.M. to the N.W. watch Employed in ships duty kept the James Andrews &

526 Remarks on Monday January 3rd 1853

capt Lee spoke us she had 870 sperm & 70 whale all told I went on
board of him at that time & came on board & stem by the wind to the N.W.
latter part of the day fine breeze from the N.W. & fine weather at 5 A.M.
at 6 A.M. made sail & stem from North to N.W. several whales in sight watch
BR 2922^{1/2} Employed in ships duty at midnight stem date so ends this day
latter in 409 34.45 S long in chronometer 50.18 west

527 Remarks on Tuesday January 4th 1853

at 6 P.M. steering North watch Employed in ships duty one whale ship George
BR 2922^{1/2} & Susan & one barque gaming at 4 P.M. steering by the wind to the Eastward
the wind falling round to the N.E. & saw before at sun down shoten sail
at 5 P.M. were ship to the N.E. mial & latter part of the day light breeze &
calms about the fore top sail & mence it & bent it at gun at 11.0 light
at 6 A.M. were sprung up from the North made sail & stem N.E. saw one big whaler
BR 2922^{1/2} new pleasant weather latter in 409 34.35 S long in chronometer 50.09 west

528 Remarks on Wednesday January 5th 1853

at 6 P.M. steering E.N.E. watch Employed in mending the jib at 4 P.M. bent it at gun
BR 2922^{1/2} & stem to the Eastward by the wind one whale at stem of us at sun down
shoten sail middle & latter part of the day strong breeze from North & ruff sea
at 6 A.M. at 5.10 double reef top sail at 7 were ship to the North saw 2 sails
BR 2922^{1/2} the day new strong breeze & ruff sea on
