 B.R. 29 1/2 fine weather steering N.E. & watch Employed in ship duty at land down track in the light sails & hauled by the wind
 each way through the night with light winds at 6 A.M. saw the
 Private rocks bearing N.E. & E & were on bearing N.E. & E at 9 A.M.
 at 6 A.M. I found mi boat & went up to the rocks & fishing & went on shore
 B.R. 29 1/2 on the rocks saw a plenty of Birco & crabs on the rock the day was
 best of fishing Let in 00.57 miles at long in by chronometer 29.20 west

 at 6 A.M. at 10 A.M. at studding sails mch & latter part of the day light winds
 B.R. 29 1/2 from E to N.W. at 4 P.M. began to rain at 5 A.M. up at 9 o'clock
 a strong barque steering to the Eastward the day was fine weather
 Let in by 04.1.25 N long in by chronometer 30.35 west

 weather at 7 calm at 9 A.M. light breeze sprang up mch & latter part of
 at 6 A.M. the day light winds from E to N.E. & fine weather some squalling rain
 B.R. 29 1/2 squalls saw one barque the day was with moon wind
 Let in by 04.3.43 N long in by chronometer 35.40 west
