 at 6 P.M. These 24 hours begins with light winds stirring clouds through
 BR 29²⁴ Mon a passage all hands employed in stowing down our various
 seals in sight at 4 P.M. saw a school of sperm whales
 we were on sounding when we raised the whale at 2 got all
 our oil down & found the butts for the whale & they perceived
 the butts came on board & began to stow off the blubber soon
 at 4 P.M. found for the whale & made until work without
 at 6 A.M. sun up came on board & started sail & finished stowing off the
 BR 29²⁴ barrels & wood heading to the south by the wind latter part of
 the day moderate breeze & variable in the Mona passage small
 seals in sight at 10 A.M. saw one sperm whale at 4 P.M.
 found 3 butts for him he had perceived the ship & but
 the day was lost off whaling

603 Remarks on Monday March 21st 1853
 at 6 P.M. These 24 hours begins with variable winds & rain & squally
 BR 29²⁴ by falls in the Mona passage near the Mona Island butts
 off after a whale small seals in sight one whaling barque
 & schooner at about 2 o'clock the latter boat went up at
 long side of whale & Harwood fell down twice & missed the
 whale at 3 P.M. came on board without success saw the whaling
 at 6 A.M. foreign butts down aier not get fast they went on board
 BR 29²⁴ at 10 A.M. down was started sail & stood off from Mona Island by
 the wind at 3 A.M. was ship to the ship at 6 A.M. made sail full
 breeze by 8 P.M. watch empty in working the day at 8 P.M. ship
 to the N.E. saw one whaling barque & one schooner at 4 P.M. ship
 ship & headed up at 6 P.M. on the day
