 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from the NW & fine
 BR 29th the weather steering NW B. I watch Employed in ship's duty pointing
 the Mastboard back & other various kinds of work saw thump
 backs wheels saw one Man's big steering to the NW & at 6 P.M.
 the wind halled rounder NW & began to blow up steam by the wind
 to the NE & much part fresh breeze & clear weather latter part light
 breeze & calm at 5 A.M. Tacked ship to the westward at 9 AM ship
 to the NE watch Employed in washing there clear saw thump backs
 BR 29th & finbacks & further at 10 AM this day once fine weather & calm
 left in 4 by 32° 15' south long in 4 chronometer 46° 32' west

 up from the NW & made sail & steam NW B. I at 11 began
 to blow up & the wind began to hally to the north began to
 take in sail & took the boat up on the upper crains latter
 part equally attended with sharp lightning & thunder at
 6 A.M. luffed to the wind heading to the ENE under a last
 ref. Main topsail fresh gales & thick weather at 10 the wind
 at 6 A.M. began to hally to the westward & clear off & moderate some
 BR 29th this day once with fair weather overhead & moderate gales
 left in 4 by 33° 24' south long in 4 chronometer 47° 00' west

 at 6 A.M. peeped to the leeward of us heading to the NE & the wind under
