

162 Remarks on Monday December 11th 1851
 at 6 PM There 24 Hours begins with strong breeze from the NW & thick
 BR 29th & rainy weather by spells & strong sea on bearing to the NW
 under short sail & the wind bearing in at 4 PM reefed fore sail & went
 ship to the NW & at 6 PM the wind let go & sailed to the NW then came on
 latter part of the day fine breeze from the NW & good weather some rugg
 at 5 AM made sail during NW watch Emphy in making the main
 sail was pulled through a large jam of finbacks at 8 AM saw a
 jam of whales I heard we took them to be Queen whales got the boats
 at 6 AM ready for them & they proved to be a jam of right whales going
 BR 29th took the NW & did not leave it being rugg this day occurred fine weather
 Lat in 40° 35' 47" South Long in 74° 30' 55" West

163 Remarks on Tuesday December 12th 1851
 at 6 PM There 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from the South & falling
 BR 29th Eastward during night watch Emphy in making the main sail at
 1 PM lowered the two quartered boats for two Right whales fully 200
 & came on board & then went at 4 PM from the two quartered
 boats for a right whale fully 200 & came on board & then
 to the North & lost the main sail saw a plenty more of right
 whales & finbacks at sun down shortened sail & then came on
 latter part of the day thick foggy weather & a moderate breeze from
 at 6 AM ESE during NW watch Emphy in ship duty I saw at one point
 BR 29th the day now foggy & nearly calm
 Lat in 40° 34' 30" South Long in 74° 30' 30" West

164 Remarks on Wednesday December 13th 1851
 at 6 PM There 24 Hours begins with calm & foggy weather thick watch
 BR 29th Emphy about the ship put on a new rope. Martin left to the
 fly jib boom at 11 AM it in to rain at 7 PM shortened sail much &
 latter part of the day fine breeze & light wind & rainy by spells
 & thick weather at 6 AM made some sail & then to the Eastward
 at 6 AM red by the wind saw a plenty of finbacks the day now thick weather
 BR 29th Lat in 40° 34' 20" South Long in 74° 30' 00" West

165 Remarks on Thursday December 14th 1851 Lat in 40° 34' 14" South
 at 6 PM There 24 Hours begins with thick weather & rainy by spells at 1 PM
 BR 29th took the ship & headed NW & made the most heads at 6 PM it began
 up we saw finbacks in every direction we then SE at 1 PM down 1 PM
 at 6 AM sail at 9 AM wind sailed to the NW & left strong breeze & rugg & fair weather
 BR 29th during SE watch plenty of finbacks the day now moderate

166 Remarks on Friday December 15th 1851
 at 6 PM There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from the NW & rugg & fair
 BR 29th weather & moderating down strong SE B watch Emphy in ship duty
 saw finbacks at sun down shortened sail & then the course latter part
 of the day fresh breeze from the westward & good weather at 6 AM made sail
 at 6 AM watch Emphy in washing there close so now this day no finbacks
 BR 29th Lat in 40° 35' 19" South Long in 74° 19' 27" West

167 Remarks on Saturday December 16th 1851
 at 6 PM There 24 Hours begins with fine breeze from the westward & fine
 BR 29th weather during SE B watch Emphy in washing there close
 saw one school of porpoise at sun down shortened sail at 1 PM
 calm at 8 AM the wind began to blow from SE & made sail &
 then by the wind to the SE & watch Emphy in ship duty saw
 at 6 AM finbacks we saw one 24 Hours without having finbacks so now
 BR 29th Lat in 40° 35' 20" South Long in 74° 30' 00" West

168 Remarks on Saturday Sunday December 17th 1851
 at 6 PM There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from the SE & fine weather
 BR 29th & a large built coming from the NW steering by the wind to the
 SE & watch Emphy in ship duty then our own mack ships to
 keep them from rusting at sun down shortened sail latter part of the
 day fresh breeze from the SE & good weather at 6 AM made sail & then by
 at 6 AM the wind to the SE & saw a plenty of finbacks so now this day
 BR 29th Lat in 40° 36' 11" South Long in 74° 30' 00" West

169 Remarks on Monday December 18th 1851
 at 6 PM There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from the SE & good weather during
 BR 29th by the wind to the SE at sun down shortened sail much & latter part of
 the day fresh breeze & smoky weather & rugg sea at 6 AM was ship
 to the NW & at double reef to sails watch Emphy in ship duty at 11
 past 11 I saw some whales off our weather beam one mile off took
 at 6 AM them to be right whales at midnight were ship so now this day
 BR 29th Lat in 40° 36' 33" South Long in 74° 30' 00" West

170 Remarks on Tuesday December 19th 1851
 at 6 PM There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from the SE & smoky weather being
 BR 29th to the windward & look for them two right whales at 1 PM & spoke
 saw nothing more of them at sun down shortened sail much & latter part of the day
 at 6 AM fine breeze from the SE & smoky weather at 6 AM made sail & then SE watch
 BR 29th Emphy in starting fresh water out the after life saw finbacks & then so now
 Lat in 40° 36' 26" South Long in 74° 30' 00" West
