 & calked her forward & painted her over lower on her bottom at
 sun down Shorten sail & wear ship to the N.W. & made sail & latter part
 of the day light winds from N.W. to N.E. & fine weather at 5 A.M.
 B.R. 29²³ made all sail watch Employ. in ship duty at 11 stars to the N.W.
 this day new fine weather. Lat by 49 35.11 N Long by Chronometer 10.50 west

180 Remarks on Friday December 29th 1854
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from N.W. & fine weather.
 B.R. 29²⁴ under all sail steering by the wind to the N.W. watch Employ. in ship
 duty sent up fore top gallant yard & fore Royal yards at 7 P.M. A
 French barge appeared a head of us steering S.E. was Exhauze, a big
 male with her at sun down we tack ship to the N.W. & Shorten sail
 latter part of the day light winds from N.W. to N.E. & cloudy weather.
 at 6 A.M. at 5 A.M. made sail & stem to the N.W. by the wind watch Employ.
 B.R. 29²⁵ in washing there clear this day new with good weather.
 Lat in by 49 37.21 South Long in by Chronometer 11.05 west

181 Remarks on Saturday December 30th 1854
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from N.W. & good weather.
 B.R. 29²⁶ steering by the wind to the N.W. watch Employ. in washing there clear
 at 11 P.M. tack ship to the N.W. & at sun down Shorten sail latter
 part fresh breeze from N.W. to N.E. & equally by spells at 5 A.M. made some
 sail steering by the wind back out the after hole after noon & started two
 casks of fresh water saw two birds at Meriden spoke the barge
 at 6 A.M. see also Gosmer of New Bedford building out a Right Whale
 B.R. 29²⁷ which makes him 250 of whale all told to end this day
 Lat in by 49 36.30 South Long in by Chronometer 10.52 west

182 Remarks on Sunday December 31st 1854
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from N.W. & thick weather by
 B.R. 29²⁸ shells steering by the wind to the N.W. watch Employ. in steering off.
 Lat by 49 36.17 the after hole at 1 P.M. the ship Mary capt. Gottle of New Bedford
 long 40 mms spoke us 3 months out clean & then she went to the west at sun down
 at 11.40 Shorten sail latter part of the day fresh breeze from N.W. to N.E. & ruff sea
 at 6 A.M. on 5 made sail saw one whaling big to the windward saw two small D. South at 11
 B.R. 29²⁹ whole course at 9 tack to the Eastward at 11 mms tack to the N.W. & on 5 day

 B.R. 29³⁰ weather steering by the wind to the N.W. watch Employ. in steering bow at 6 P.M.
 nearly calm at sun down Shorten sail latter part of the day fine breeze from
 N.W. & good weather at 5 A.M. made sail & stem 11 mms to the N.W. the
 lance at 4 A.M. bound 3 boats for Right whale galled & came on board
 plenty more in sight saw a Brig A whaling to the windward at 1st past
 10 bound the Starboard & Main boats & got fast to the Starboard boat
 at 6 A.M. & then bound the Starboard boat the which run to the windward & killed
 B.R. 29³¹ him to the Starboard boat the which big got a whale this day new
 all 3 boats off fast to a right whale

 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze all 3 boats off fast to a right
 B.R. 29³² whale at 1st past 1 P.M. got the whale fluked a long side got
 ready & commenced cutting in the whale the which big to the windward
 cutting at sun down we got the whale all on board got down cutting
 tackle & got supper & set the watch & then Shorten sail to a double
 reef Main & fore sail & got ready for boiling & made a
 fire & commenced boiling the meat in for the land at 1 P.M. we
 ship latter part of the day fresh breeze from the North & ruff & thick
 at 6 A.M. weather by shells at 8 A.M. wear ship to the N.W. saw one barge &
 B.R. 29³³ saw a big building this day new many hours & thickish weather
 Lat in by 49 36.15 South no long & day

185 Remarks on Wednesday January 3rd 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from N.W. to N.E. & thick
 B.R. 29³⁴ weather by shells & rain all hands Employ. in boiling & cutting horse
 pieces saw the Super 5 Brig Pioneer to the windward boiling at 1
 P.M. we wear ship to the N.W. & saw two right whales at 10 P.M. equally
 & rising attended with thunder & lightning cooled down plenty of rain
 at 4 A.M. made a fire & began to boil the wine killed to the North &
 changed off good weather at 6 A.M. saw two right whales going to the
 at 6 A.M. windward at 11 A.M. saw one but this day new light winds & pleasant
 B.R. 29³⁵ weather Lat in by 49 36.29 South Long in by Chronometer 11.05 west
