 A left it being to ruff latter part of the day fresh breeze from 11 E to
 1 E & cloudy at 5 A.M. made sail & stored by the wine bracing from
 E Bet to E & E watch Empty, in ships duty saw one strong sail
 at 6 A.M. to the windward on the opposite tack this day ends good whole weather
 BR 29⁴⁰ Left in 4 09 34.09 South Long in 4 chronometer 8.05 west

195 Remarks on Saturday January 13th 1855
 at 6 PM These 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from 18 E & cloudy weather
 BR 29⁴⁰ steering by the wind bracing E & E & E Bet watch Empty, in ships duty
 bunching up our whole bone & stored it in fore hold next to the bulkhead
 at sun down Mortine laid latter part of the day fine breeze from E to
 1 E & good weather at 5 A.M. made sail & stored by the wine to the N.E.
 watch Empty, in ships duty took out our potatoes & dry. on them &
 at 6 A.M. put them back & hooked out the after hold & got out corn so ends this day
 BR 29⁴⁰ Left in 4 09 33.00 South Long in 4 chronometer 8.10 west

196 Remarks on Sunday January 14th 1855
 at 6 PM These 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from East & fine
 BR 29⁴⁰ weather Mering by the wine to the N.E. watch Empty, in ships duty
 stored off the after hold & other various kinds of work at sun down took
 ship to the 1 E & Mortine laid latter part of the day fine breeze from N.E. to
 N.W. & fine weather at 5 A.M. made sail & stored to the Eastward by the
 at 6 A.M. wine bracing from E 18 to E Bet nothing in sight so ends this day
 BR 29⁴⁰ Left in 4 09 32.36 South Long in 4 chronometer 8.16 west

197 Remarks on Monday January 15th 1855
 at 6 PM These 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from N.E. & fine weather moderate
 BR 29⁴⁰ laid steering E Bet at 3 M. E & E at sun down Mortine laid & stored by the
 wine to the N.E. latter part of the day fresh breeze from N.W. & cloudy weather
 at 5 A.M. made sail & stored 1 E & E hooked out the fore hold & got out the old
 main spruce & old fore deck sail at 10 A.M. the wine wine pulled to the 14 M.
 in a squall of rain at 4 P.M. 10 fair weather low cloud at 10 P.M. but no
 at 6 A.M. nothing more afterwards lay aback some minutes so ends this day
 BR 29⁴⁰ Left in 4 09 32.10 South Long in 4 chronometer 8.25 west

198 Remarks on Tuesday January 16th 1855
 at 6 PM These 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from 1 N.W. & fine weather
 BR 29⁴⁰ steering 1 E watch Empty, in ships duty finishing a storing off fore hold
 & bent main spruce & main. a fore topmast. Muzzled & bent it at
 sun down Mortine laid middle & latter part of the day fresh breeze from
 the N.W. & rugg. sea on at 5 A.M. 14 P.M. & speaker was took out our
 at 6 A.M. potatoes in the after hold & sorted them over this day ends more moderate
 BR 29⁴⁰ Left in 4 09 32.19 South Long in 4 chronometer 8.25 west

199 Remarks on Wednesday January 17th 1855
 at 6 PM These 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from 18 N.W. & rugg. sea on
 BR 29⁴⁰ following by the wine to the 1 E watch Empty, in ships duty various kinds
 of work on board at sun down Mortine laid latter part of the day moderate
 breeze from 1 E to 1 E & cloudy weather at 5 A.M. made sail & stored
 by the wine to the Eastward watch Empty, in clearing the rust of the iron
 at 6 A.M. work inside & painting it over at 11 saw one school of porpoise
 BR 29⁴⁰ this day ends with light winds & good weather for sailing
 Left in 4 09 31.16 South Long in 4 chronometer 8.10 miles East

200 Remarks on Thursday January 18th 1855
 at 6 PM These 24 Hours begins with light winds from 11 E & good weather
 BR 29⁴⁰ unarrall laid steering by the wine to the Eastward watch Empty, in
 clearing the rust of the iron work inside & painting it over brown
 at sun down Mortine laid middle & latter part of the day light winds from
 1 E to E & fine weather at 5 A.M. made sail & took ship & headed
 11 E was launched for top gallant mast & took off the rope trees & made
 at 6 A.M. A new trussel tree one of them being broke this day ends pleasant weather
 BR 29⁴⁰ Left in 4 09 31.29 South Long in 4 chronometer 8.10 miles East
