

225 Remarks on Monday February 12th 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with light winds & fine pleasant weather &
 B.R. 29th A smooth sea all hands Employed in cutting in our whale &
 boiling the large oranche in light to the windward at sun
 down we got the head off & away in & left the head a long side
 & let the watch boiling & clearing away the jaw & jaws
 made & latter part of the day light winds & fine weather boiling
 at 6 A.M. saw a strong breeze to the windward at 11 A.M. finished
 boiling out our first whale & we took on to our other head
 overboard & cut off the junk & commenced boiling the case at 6
 at 6 A.M. A.M. we saw a ship to the windward & going quick to the
 B.R. 29th windward this day ends fine weather all hands Employed in boiling the case
 left in 4 of 22.29 South Long in 4 chronometer 7.40 East

226 Remarks on Tuesday February 13th 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with light winds & fine weather all
 B.R. 29th hands Employed in boiling the whole case at 1 P.M. we
 saw a large lone whale bearing East from us & going to
 the westward at 2 P.M. we finished boiling the case
 got down truck as made sail & lowerd all 3 boats for the
 whole the waist boat got obly fast & Draved the iron &
 then the Mainboard boat went up to the whole & got fast & the
 whole with the boat in two Henry J Bentley cooper got caught
 in the line & was Draved under water & was Draved
 we saw the things & line belonging to the boat & let the boat
 be in Halling up the line we found the cooper fast in the
 line dead we came on board & kept off for the whole but
 did not get down to him until sun down we went to the
 the westward & got ready for boiling much part fresh hams
 latter part more moderate all hands Employed in cutting
 blubber & boiling & other work on board at 9 A.M. we buried
 at 6 A.M. Henry J Bentley in the blue sea this day ends good weather
 B.R. 29th nothing in sight to be remarkable
 left in 4 of 22.26 South Long in 4 chronometer 8.20 East

227 Remarks on Wednesday February 14th 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze & good weather bearing to the NW
 B.R. 29th by the wind under double reef Main Tarpaulin & for sail all hands Employed
 in cutting blubber & boiling at 3 P.M. we took a boat down from weather
 & put her on the Mainboard crains & then got out some cash out of
 the fore hold at 6 let the watch make & latter part of the day fine breeze
 & good weather all hands Employed in cutting storm pieces making &
 at 6 A.M. boiling & taking care of the oil this day ends good weather
 B.R. 29th left in 4 of 22.59 South Long in 4 chronometer 7.40 East

228 Remarks on Thursday February 15th 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with fine trade breeze & good weather all hands
 B.R. 29th Employed in boiling & taking care of oil at 1 P.M. we ship to the
 E.P.E. washed off the decks got all the blubber cut in the storm pieces
 at 6 P.M. fresh breeze & the wind increasing much & latter part
 of the day strong breeze & thick weather & a ruggid sea on all
 hands Employed in boiling & storing down oil on the Larboard
 at 6 A.M. side of the after hold in the ground from this day ends ruggid
 B.R. 29th left in 4 of 22.11 South Long in 4 chronometer 7.54 East

229 Remarks on Friday February 16th 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with strong breeze thick smooth weather
 B.R. 29th & a ruggid sea on all hands Employed in boiling & storing
 down oil in the after hold at sun down finished storing of
 the after hold stored down 36 bbls of head at 10 P.M. finished
 boiling & turned up the oil much part strong breeze & ruggid
 latter part more moderate but ruggid sea & thick smooth
 weather at 8 A.M. commenced heaving out the main hole between
 at 6 A.M. the fore & Main Hatch on the Larboard side to store down oil
 B.R. 29th the day ends ruggid all hands Employed in pumping fresh water
 left in 4 of 22.23 South Long in 4 chronometer 8.25 East

230 Remarks on Saturday February 17th 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with strong breeze & thick weather & a
 B.R. 29th ruggid sea on heading to the E.P.E. by the wind under short
 sail all hands Employed in storing down oil at sun down
 left off work got the Larboard side between fore & main Hatch
 filled & stored off much & latter part more moderate & smooth weather
 at 6 A.M. watch Employed in heaving out the starboard side & pumping water
 B.R. 29th storing down oil heading to the westward this day ends storing down oil
 left in 4 of 22.10 South Long in 4 chronometer 8.25 East
