 ships duty grinding boarding & mending knives & other various
 kinds of work put 2 new pieces of grate in the stove finished washing
 out my room at Sun down was ship to the N.W. made & latter part
 of the day fresh breeze & fair weather at 6 A.M. at 1st Gibb & speaker at 10
 at 6 A.M. Mind over at Meridon stand at 10 to make this day
 BR 29th left in 40° 22.53' South Long in 4° 06' East
