 B.R. 24th A smooth sea for this ground steering at 12 watch Empty
 about the ship at 12 past 3 then at 2 at sun down shorted sail
 then by the wind to the ESE at 12 were ship to the NW by the part
 of the day moderate breeze & good weather under all sail steering
 by the wind to the SE watch Empty about the ship saw one
 at 6 A.M. large school of porpoise this day once fine weather
 B.R. 24th Lett in 4 by 22° 54' south long in 4 chronometer 9° 05' East

269 Remarks on Wednesday March 28th 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with a moderate breeze & good weather
 B.R. 24th was under all sail steering by the wind to the SE watch Empty
 ship duty at 11 P.M. took ship to the ESE at sun down shorted sail
 much & latter part of the day light winds & a smooth sea & some
 smoky at 3 A.M. caught one porpoise at 6 A.M. sail saw one
 barque to the windward under short sail watch Empty in ship
 at 6 A.M. duty at Minion Tack ship to the SE to leave this day good weather
 B.R. 24th Lett in 4 by 22° 06' south long in 4 chronometer 9° 50' East

270 Remarks on Thursday March 29th 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze & a smooth sea &
 B.R. 24th smoky weather under all sail steering by the wind to the ESE
 watch Empty in ship duty speaking over the iron work in line
 Red counter at 4 P.M. saw a sail off our lee beam at sundown shorted
 sail much & latter part of the day moderate breeze & smooth sea
 at 6 A.M. were ship to the SE at 11 A.M. all sail watch Empty in ship
 at 6 A.M. duty sitting up chain & topmast & top gallant masts saw 2 schools
 B.R. 24th of porpoise at Minion Tack ship to the ESE to leave this day
 Lett in 4 by 22° 13' south long in 4 chronometer 9° 20' East

271 Remarks on Friday March 30th 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze & a smooth sea
 B.R. 24th & good weather under all sail steering by the wind to the ESE watch
 Empty in ship duty at sun down shorted sail at 12 were ship
 to the SE by the part of the day fine breeze & good weather at
 6 A.M. made sail watch Empty in washing & mending then
 saw saw porpoise at 11 past 11 A.M. top gallant sail
 at 6 A.M. at Minion Tack ship to the ESE to leave this day good weather
 B.R. 24th Lett in 4 by 22° 36' south long in 4 chronometer 9° 30' East

272 Remarks on Saturday March 31st 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze & good weather steering
 B.R. 24th by the wind to the ESE watch Empty in washing then at sun
 down shorted sail & were ship to the SE at 12 were ship to the
 SE at 3 caught one porpoise at 6 were ship to the SE & 1st J.C.
 Spenser & Main sail fresh breeze & ruff sea at 8 broke out the
 after hole to start 4 cask of fresh water next to the bulk head
 at 6 A.M. at 11 past 11 saw one barque off our lee beam to leave this day
 B.R. 24th alone & no observation to day

273 Remarks on Sunday April 1st 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze & ruff & heavy steering
 B.R. 24th by the wind to the SE watch Empty in pumping fresh
 water next to the bulk head in the after hole & filling with
 salt water we have got all the fresh water out of the ground
 Tank but one cask in the fore hold one sail off our lee beam
 steering to the SE at sun down shorted sail & were ship to the SE
 latter part of the day more moderate at 6 A.M. were ship to the SE
 at 6 A.M. & made sail at Minion Tack even to leave this day good weather
 B.R. 24th Lett in 4 by 23° 01' south long in 4 chronometer 9° 10' East

274 Remarks on Monday April 2nd 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze & fine weather steering at 2
 B.R. 24th at 1 P.M. 1st Main top gallant sail at 1 past 3 then at 2 at sun down
 shorted sail & then by the wind to the ESE at 6 A.M. were ship
 to the SE & 1st J.C. & Spenser fresh breeze & smoky weather
 at 6 A.M. watch Empty in ship duty at Minion Tack ship to the SE
 B.R. 24th Lett in 4 by 22° 33' south long in 4 chronometer 9° 15' East

275 Remarks on Tuesday April 3rd 1855
 at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze & smoky weather steering
 B.R. 24th by the wind to the ESE watch Empty in ship duty at sun down
 took in J.C. & Spenser latter part of the day blowing a Gale of
 wind & very rough sea on at 12 at night were ship to the
 SE at 6 shorted sail for to sail & took the boats on up for
 coals at 8 called the men down from the Mast Heads & then
 stand by for this day more with fair weather & strong winds
 at 6 A.M. & a ruff sea on at Minion Tack even to leave this day
 B.R. 24th Lett in 4 by 22° 32' south long in 4 chronometer 9° 20' East
