 at 6 A.M. made sail at 7 then it was to the W. N. W. & on bent the fore
 at 6 A.M. fore sail & began to repair it this day more more at 6 A.M. & much

278 Remarks on Friday April 6th 1855
 at 6 P.M. These 24 Hours begins begins with a fine breeze & smooth weather
 BR 29th & ruff 14 but moderating during N.W. watch empty in
 Repairing the fore fore sail at 4 P.M. finished the fore fore sail & bent
 it at 6 P.M. saw a sperm whale being shot by a boat from 1 1/2 miles
 from us then off for him at 8 past 5 found the boat and
 went to see for the whale he was coming up for the ship the
 boat got mad down to him & he turned & fled & went down
 & he did not come up at 8 till after sun down did not
 see them out of the boat came on board & double ruff the
 fore sail & then by the wind backing E. & E. the whale going
 E. & E. at 6 A.M. back to ship & then by the wind to the W. N. W. & more
 at 6 A.M. fair fine weather watch empty in washing then it was to more
 BR 29th Lett in 4 of 20-05 South long in 4 chronometer 5-30 East

279 Remarks on Saturday April 7th 1855
 at 6 P.M. These 24 Hours begins with light winds & fine weather & some
 BR 29th The heavy sea on stirring North watch empty in making the fore sail
 long in washing then it was to at 4 P.M. then it was to the W. N. W. & came
 ship to the 18 at 1 A.M. was ship to the 14 in latter part of the day fine weather at 6 A.M.
 at 6 A.M. made sail & then it was to the W. N. W. & got out all our own & got out paper to more the day
 BR 29th Lett in 4 of 19-11 South long in 4 chronometer 4-50 East

 at 6 P.M. These 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze & fine weather some smooth during
 BR 29th At 1 P.M. was killed our grey cow pig at 3 then it was to the W. N. W. & at sun down
 then it was to the W. N. W. & then by the wind to the W. N. W. & latter part of the
 Day fine breeze & fine weather & smooth at 6 A.M. made sail & then
 at 6 A.M. on this day more fine weather saw one piece of spirit

 at 6 P.M. These 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from South & fine weather
 BR 29th & smooth during N.W. watch empty in making the fore sail
 & then by the wind to the W. N. W. & latter part of the day light winds
 & smooth sea & heavy at 6 A.M. made sail & then it was to the W. N. W. & watch
 at 6 A.M. empty about the ship at Meriden then it was to the W. N. W. & more this day
 BR 29th Lett in 4 of 18-52 South long in 4 chronometer 1-55 East

282 Remarks on Tuesday April 10th 1855
 at 6 P.M. These 24 Hours begins with light winds & fine smooth weather
 BR 29th During N.W. watch empty in ship duty painting the iron work
 inside black at sun down then it was to the W. N. W. & then by the wind to the
 W. N. W. & latter part of the day light winds & a smooth sea
 & pleasant weather at 6 A.M. made sail & then it was to the W. N. W. & more
 saw in school of porpoise & one piece of spirit was in boat the
 at 6 A.M. ship & killed a stick it at Meriden then it was to the W. N. W. & more this day
 BR 29th Lett in 4 of 18-36 South long in 4 chronometer 00-45 miles East

283 Remarks on Wednesday April 11th 1855
 at 6 P.M. These 24 Hours begins with light breeze & a smooth sea & pleasant
 BR 29th The weather during North watch empty in ship duty finished the fore
 & bent it back down the spanker & ruff & then it was to the W. N. W. & put them up
 a gun at sun down then it was to the W. N. W. & then the course was much &
 latter part of the day light winds & pleasant weather back out
 the after hold & got out one keg of Butter & pumped two cask
 of fresh water in the fore hold & in the ground saw the last fish
 at 6 A.M. water in the ground saw one fin back this day more light winds
 BR 29th Lett in 4 of 17-21 South long in 4 chronometer on Meriden at more
