 porpoise jumping thought it was a spout at Sun Down Shortened  
 sail at 3 A.M. saw ship to the N.W. it commenced raining by squalls  
 until 1/2 past 5 A.M. then cleared off. Made all sail at 10 noon & calm  
 at 5 A.M. this Day Ende nearly calm & pleasant weather saw porpoise

 at 5 A.M. weather at 5 A.M. made sail at 10 past Down. Main top gall sail &  
 33.80 Lat in By 33.10 N Long in By Chronomet. 49.10 west  
 at 5 A.M. commenced repairing it at 4 past 10 saw 3 porpoises & 4 points off our

 15 miles from the ship & then gave them up. Black fish came up  
 A mong them & porpoise at 20 minutes before 11 P.M. the Starboard  
 & main Boats came on board 20 minutes before 5. the Starboard  
 Boat got on board calm weather at Sun Down Shortened sail at  
 11 P.M. the wind Bore from the South then to the N.E.  
 latter part squally & Raining by squalls at 5 A.M. Jett & Speaker
