

1171 Remarks on Monday October 15th 1855
at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours Began with light winds from the S.W. & fine weather. Misting by the wind to the westward. Middle & latter part of the Day light airs all round the compass & calm & pleasant weather. Watch Employed in Ship's Duty. Lashed up the pendant shackles to the main mast.
at 6 P.M. There with a New lashing this Day Ends light air
BR 29th from 18 to 24 in By 0.39 or long in 3 hours 10.27

1172 Remarks on Tuesday October 16th 1855
at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours Began with light air from the South & pleasant weather. Misting to the N.W. by the wind. Watch Employed in Ship's Duty. Shifted Ends with main 3rd belt. Braes run new bolts to the main 3rd belt & sorted over the potatoes in the after pen. Middle & latter part of the Day light air all round the compass & calm & raining from N. West 12 at night to N. West 1. At 3 A.M. heard 3 Boats after Black fish & No 3 Boats in to 3 fish. But would not get fast came on board. A light breeze sprung up from the N.W. & then S.W.
at 6 A.M. So Ends this Day light air from the Eastward
BR 29th from 18 to 24 in By 0.29 or long in By Chron 18.32 west

1173 Remarks on Wednesday October 17th 1855
at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours Began with light air from the East & pleasant weather. Misting S.W. when we can watch Employed in Ship's Duty. finished sorting over our potatoes. Middle & latter part of the Day light winds all round the compass & calm & some Rain squalls at 9 A.M. the wind breezed up from N.W. for a short time & then away Misting S.W. this Day Ends with a Black &
at 6 A.M. wind squalls arising from the S.E. attended with thunder
BR 29th from 18 to 24 in By 0.27 or long in By Chron 18.11 west

1174 Remarks on Thursday October 18th 1855
at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours Began with light squalls arising from S.E.
BR 29th at 12 got to work in all sail but for 1st & 2nd. 3rd blew strong for a while & then was made 1st thick & squally Misting by the wind. Misting from 1st to 2nd
at 6 A.M. to 1 P.M. at 7 about calm latter part of the Day calm & pleasant
BR 29th the Day Ends light air from 5 to 7.26 or long in 3 hours 18.36

1175 Remarks on Friday October 19th 1855
at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours Began with air from the S.E. & calm & pleasant weather. Watch Employed in Ship's Duty. Middle part light air all round the compass & calm & a plenty of thunder & lightning & some Rain. Latter part light air from S.W. & good weather. Misting to the S.E. by the wind. Watch Employed in washing & mending the clothes. Ends this Day
BR 29th from 18 to 24 in By 0.37 or long in By Chron 18.13 west

1176 Remarks on Saturday October 20th 1855
at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours Began with light air of wind from the S.W. & good weather. Misting by the wind to the S.E. watch Employed in washing & mending the clothes at 1 P.M. saw a Man sail off our lee Bow standing to the westward by the wind. Middle part light air from the S.W. & calm at 10 P.M. I took a Bucket of piss to Albert & Richard when he was asleep in this watch on Deck & he got up & told me he went to sleep & then the Bucket at him. But did not hit him. I lent him on top of the foremast & told him to stand up until the watch was out & when they struck the B. 11 at 11 P.M. I told him to get down & wash the piss off of himself & go to bed & he was made & then this gentleman on Deck the sailor he wanted to try the father said nothing was the matter with him. He went below & I went in & went to sleep came on deck at 3 A.M. Bright as a New pin. Latter part light air from the S.W. & calm at 8 A.M. heard the watch boat for Black fish could not get fast came on board to 8
BR 29th Ends this Day from 5 to 6.39 or long in By Chron 17.54 west

1177 Remarks on Sunday October 21st 1855
at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours Began with light breezes from the N.W. & pleasant weather. Watch Employed in Ship's Duty. at 6 saw Black fish at 1 A.M. calm at 2 thick & squally all round the compass & a plenty of thunder & sharp lightning at 3 the wind breezed from the N.W. & variable squally & raining Misting by the wind. Tuckered ship several times this Day Ends light breeze from N.W. & clear
BR 29th from 18 to 24 in By Chron 18.10 or long in By the same 18.00 west
