 off shore heavy breeze at 12 nearly calm then
 the breezes latter part light breeze & calm at Day light
 we was 2 miles from the land got our anchor ready
 for anchoring saw the Brig Paradox of Fish Bay bound
 in at 10 A.M. the sea breeze sprung up then for Olanow
 at 6 A.M. to Ende this Day fine weather Mowing down to the port
 BR 29th Lat in By 9.21 South
