

Scout came with thick rainy weather at 2 pm wind veered to the
Sunday south with rain at 6 pm clear ship under short sail
 28th heading to the westward mid light airs at 4 pm and
 James Earl, seamen grossly insulted the third officer
 and struck him first took the men off and put him
 in the riggin gave him two dozen at 9 am sent one
 boat on shore at the island of Mocha for potatoes at
 Merredien returned with five lbs thus end

Scout came with calm ship within 2 miles let go anchor
Monday in 17 fathoms water closed up sails and sent in
 Feb 29th 3 boats for potatoes at 4 pm returned with 22 lbs
 2 boats returned again at 7 pm returned with one boat
 load of mud some sticks at 8 pm light airs got under
 way at 9 secured anchor ship steamed 8 am mid light airs
 at 1 am wind increasing drove all sail later down south
 wind came 8 & 9 ship making 10 knots beam for Salcedo

Laying At Anchor In Salcedo

Scout came with strong breeze at 4 pm rounded
 March 1st Curacena down tacks to beat up to Salcedo
 at 11 pm came to anchor in ten fathoms water
 closed up sails the town dist one mile dist. Calas
 thus end sea account

Scout Tuesday March 2nd

came with heavy short to stand up to the anchorage
 at 9 am came to anchor in five fathoms water
 furled sails and began to clean ship midnight calm

Scout Wednesday March 3rd

came with fine weather sent shortland watch
 on shore thick weather employed in setting up shanks
 for water at 4 pm got off one cask water
 midnight fine weather

Scout Thursday March 4th

came with fine weather at 7 am sent in for
 the watch found three men shurring Colvin Trip
 George Gunnet ~~Thomas~~ Thomas Milcox at 8 am
 Mr Inger Second Officer came on board in a bad
 state and would not listen to reason if I remained
 on board he should go on shore which he did sent
 the other watch on shore cooper setting up shanks
 at 1 pm commenced painting at 6 pm nearly finished
 one side midnight fresh breezes from south & E

Scout Friday March 5th

came with fine weather sent one watch on shore
 Mr Inger still remaining on shore this day found
 that Gunnet Milcox had deserted his post finished
 painting ship
