 (July 1st) was ship to the south one sail in sight no whale
 & down aloft all day this end

(S. M. P.) and with equally weather at night spoke ship
 (Sunday) since 24 months since at short night strong
 (August 1st) breeze was ship later nothing in sight but faint
 lett 19.05 91.04

(S. M. P.) and with strong breeze at short night near ship
 (Monday) to S. & sails in sight and no whales sail end
 (August 2nd) latter heavy weather one sail in sight this end

(S. M. P.) and with heavy weather ship heading S. & under
 (Tuesday) double reefs sail and latter heavy weather ship
 (August 3rd) in sight no whale & down aloft all day & end
 lett 19.40 90.36

(S. M. P.) and with rugged weather ship under double
 (Wednesday) reefs heading to the south at 4 pm & sails in
 sight sail strong breeze like the same & sails
 in sight none sailing or cutting this end

(S. M. P.) and with strong winds several sails in sight no whale
 (Thursday) at 6 pm ship heading to S. & sail and latter strong
 (August 4th) wind and thick weather empty in breaking
 for sails and broad bent old fore topmast & end

(S. M. P.) and with moderate breeze and thick weather
 (Friday) at night spoke bark Hopeful since part
 (August 5th) light breeze and heavy swell ship heading to S. &
 sail calm latter the same this end

(S. M. P.) and with light air and heavy swell sail
 (Saturday) at 7 am light breeze at 9 am sail & ship to lower
 (August 6th) whaling kept off for them set down Thayer at 11 am
 down & look but no whale than end with running
 for the whales

 (S. M. P.) and with fine breeze at 2 pm saw one whale to lower
 (Sunday) and one boat went on within 2 miles the whale near
 (August 7th) we then went on & back in chase at 5 pm. Sailed
 boat got within 5 or 10 fathoms with one of the pieces
 boats the same distance would not have been together
 whale pulled went down came up to surface
 going to surface now night if we had been closer
 I should have thought but this officers had orders not
 to make noise and constitution had been clearing
 all day. Saw the Thayer cutting at 4 pm later
 ship heading to the south sail just trying to speak
 for the whale at daylight 6 sails in sight this
 day put a boat down in the rigging for grass work
 the captain wanted to take his own way but declined

(S. M. P.) and with light air ship heading to the S. & sails
 (August 8th) in sight and no whale sail and latter sail
 (Monday) ship heading to the south this end

(S. M. P.) and with strong several sails in sight the ship
 (Tuesday) there sailing 13 ships up to this time has got
 (August 10th) one whale up close sail and latter very large
 & sails in sight this end
