December 31st) saw some and strong wind and little more
moderate to the ship in shore 2 sails in sight

Steamer) Com' with strong wind nothing in sight at 6 pm
Friday) doubled reefed furled main course and
December 1st) and thick weather getting out water 2 sails

Steamer) Com' with thick weather ship heading in shore
Saturday) at daylight saw the land at 10 am and dist
December 2nd) 7 miles from a Humphock's General Store
last calm day while lower Eastward boat Eastward
boat struck took in shore at 240 speed succeeded
in getting 2 lines at him he ran in the breakers high
and lay on the rocks and killed himself but the line
trying to get the last clew of the breakers got clear
and returned in and picked up the line again
commenced towing off shore so far
