Sund Comm with strong breeze ship heading S.W. 3 S one sail in sight heading to the Eastward at 8 pm wind increasing took 15th in light sails and strong breeze with rain later more moderate all sail set heading S.W. nothing in sight thus End

Lat 120.2 Long 32.06

Monday Comm with strong breeze at 3 pm saw birds off lee beam clearing at 3.5 miles ship heading S.W. 3 S the wind at 6 pm took in light sails and more ship heading S.W. 3 S and strong breeze at 8 am more ship heading S.W. thick weather at 9 am saw head island off lee beam nothing more in sight thus End

Lat 140 South

Tuesday Comm with strong breeze ship heading S.W. nothing in sight at 6 pm tacked ship heading S.W. 1/2 E land still in sight took in light sails for the night and strong breeze at 8 am more ship heading S.W. saw head island in sight at 10 am saw head island run for them proved to be finbacks 1 mile in sight thus End

Second Mate Sick off Duty

Wednesday Comm with strong breeze at 6 pm spoke ship Edward Perry July 18th of 24 tons built 20 tons 400 miles per hour heading to the East and strong breeze and thick weather later the same 9 sails in sight head island dist 10 miles thus End heading to the Eastward

Thursday Comm with strong breeze with one flag 1 sail in sight at 1 pm saw ship to the Eastward at 6 pm more ship to the Westward head island off lee beam dist 7 miles ship just heading to the S.W. at 8 am more ship heading S.W. 1/2 E Charles island in sight off lee beam thus End nothing in sight & then aloft all day

Friday Comm with strong breeze ship heading to the Eastward one sail in sight Charles island and head island at 6 pm took in light sails and strong breeze heading to the East at 7 am more ship heading S.W. saw head island in sight dist 30 miles thus End

Cruising Off The Galapagos Islands

Sund Comm with strong breeze course in S.W. at 2 pm hauled on the wind to the Eastward at 3 pm one sail in sight at 6 pm more ship to the Eastward and strong breeze with thick weather at 8 am head island in sight heading S.W. 3 S later heading to the Eastward nothing in sight thus End

Lat 120

Monday Comm with strong wind heading to the Eastward nothing in sight ship just heading to the Eastward at daylight made sail more ship heading S.W. for Charles island later part running by the island finbacks in sight thus End thick weather

Tuesday Comm with moderate breeze with thick weather at 6 pm Charles island dist 20 miles bearing S.W. and one sail in sight at sundown shortened sail for the night heading to the S.W. at dawn more ship heading to the Eastward at daylight Charles island 3 pts off lee beam thick weather at 11 am more ship off shore nothing in sight thus End

Wednesday Comm with thick weather nothing in sight at 6 pm took in light sails and light breeze at 11 pm more ship in sight at daylight made all sail later thick weather nothing in sight thus End

Thursday Comm with light breeze at 2 pm saw Charles island off lee beam dist 30 miles ship heading S.W. at 6 pm took in light sails and light breeze at daylight the same kept off towards Charles island dist 25 miles at 10 am hauled on the wind to the Eastward at Merriellian more ship to the S.W. thus End nothing in sight

Friday Comm with light breeze at 3 pm tacked ship to the Eastward Charles island off the lee beam at 6 pm took in light sails and light breeze at daylight made all sail steering S.W. 1/2 E at 11 am saw head island later the same nothing in sight and the Lord knows when there will be six then aloft from daylight till supper time see nothing
