

Log of the *Greyhound* of the *Westport*

Remarks Comm' with fine clear weather at 4 pm buffed to the wind to the westward under the lee of Ellington at 6 pm tacked ship took in light sails and courses and hauled aback head yards at daylight made all sail Steady & light breeze the same fine and clear nothing in sight
Satt 1.14.57

Remarks Comm' with clear weather course & light at 2 pm passed a large Steamer to the westward and put in light breeze latter the same employed in scraping and work on the dead logs that ended nothing in sight
Satt 20.14.57

Remarks Comm' with strong breeze at 4 pm squally took in light sails ship heading E.S.E. and by the wind latter Steady S.E. and thus end
Satt 27.57

Remarks Comm' with strong breeze course S.W. at 5 pm spoke ship Steady on at 8 am by the wind and strong breeze latter Steady E.S.E. employed in cleaning iron work on the windlass that ended nothing seen
Satt 28.57 lost 26.00

Remarks Comm' with light breeze ship by the wind heading East nothing in sight employed in cleaning iron work
October 29th) Ship light breeze latter the same nothing in sight but fine weather

Remarks Comm' with light breeze ship heading to the Eastward at 3 pm one sail in sight heading the same and strong breeze latter the same nothing in sight thus end
Satt 32.14.57

Bound to St. Salome

Remarks Comm' with strong breeze one sail in sight at 6 pm spoke Margate Trinidad and Steady to the westward at 10 am tacked to the westward strong wind doubled reefed this end nothing in sight

Remarks Comm' with strong wind at 2 pm wore ship to the Westward at 5 pm Steady and reefed this end strong breeze latter the same ship heading S.E. thus end
Satt 14.57

Remarks Comm' with strong breeze and thick weather nothing in sight and strong wind latter more Steady and latter thick weather nothing in sight thus end
Satt 22.14.57 lost 20.00

Remarks Comm' with light breeze ship heading S.E. at 4 pm saw the land at 7 1/2 pm tacked ship off the the town of Montserrat at 2 1/2 miles and put by in off on daylight land at 2 miles tacked ship off shore latter put in of that in sight to windward at 10 am tacked ship in shore bound in to Salome for wood and water at 12 heading up along shore thus end

Remarks Comm' with light breeze ship heading in shore at 1 pm got up chains and bent them at 5 pm could not latter the Port thick weather tacked off shore one sail in sight and calm latter the same nothing in sight

Remarks Comm' with surging in at 4 1/2 pm came to anchor at Salome in 2 fathoms water and 30 fathoms chain and calmed at daylight landed and began to cut wood latter the same thus end
