

Log of Barque Greenpeace of Westport

Monday Calm with fair wind at 4 pm wind increased
Thursday with heavy rain close reefed at 6 pm increasing
 to a gale both in fore & main and secured all the
 sails packed both courses solid for a heavy gale
 Ship heave to heading 10 m at 11 pm wind veered to
 the South. Reft off 10 m at 11 pm fore & main close reefed and
 reefed fore sail at 11 1/2 pm wind increased to a tremendous
 heavy gale with large breaking sea took in fore & main
 and sent under strain both sails and reefed fore sail
 Ship making 12 knots per hour the Barque Scud
 Liner no mistake the barometer this night down
 to the lowest notch at 5 am wind abating shore
 sail according to the light breeze with large swell
 Ship rolling heavy very uncomfortable this end closing
 Salt by D to 42.50 but 38.50

Tuesday Calm with calm and heavy smelt ship rolling
Friday heavy at 7 pm both heavy rain at midnight
 Sun to westward ship heading 10 m of the wind came down
 increasing doubled reefed the fore
 Salt 4.00 but 36.00

Wednesday Calm with heavy wind from westward large sea
Saturday this day found two feet water in the
 fore hold fore one of the run all of the
 pumps went to take the water on regeer one
 pump and put it down in the fore hold
 at 9 pm got all rigged and began to pump
 her found one large leak in the fore hold
 the Starboard 8 light Steer partly in
 admitting a 4 inch stream of water. Succeeded
 in partly stopping it at 10 1/2 pm set the water
 at midnight got half the water pumped out made
 some sail wind 8 m tight at 5 am heave ship to
 and put copper over the leak tight in the fore hold
 at 10 finished and made all sail stearing 10 m
 thus end
 Salt 39.25

Monday Calm with light breeze and thick weather and 16
Thursday Calm with light breeze and thick weather and 16
 June 24th) up chains to get ready to clear the pump wells
 water not coming to the pumps and had sent the
 passage as it might at 6 pm ship & the wind heading
 10 m wind east and the same later shifted the
 wind veering close to the South thus end

Salt 37.50 Log 34.12

Monday Calm with strong breeze from 10 m & 24
Monday Ship heading 10 m by the wind at 7 pm a sea swell
 June 24th) Ship heading 10 m the same at 8 am began
 to clean out the pump wells at 10 am finished and
 put the pump back again this end
 Salt 36.50

Tuesday Calm with strong breeze and head sea ship
Tuesday heading 10 m wind North the Lead only 10 m
 June 25th) when we had have a fair wind and strong breeze
 doubled reefed at 4 am fore main course and took in fore
 at 10 am reefed fore course and closed reefed fore & main
 thick weather thus end ship heading 10 m by the wind
 Salt 38.50 no 60

Wednesday Calm with light gale ship heave to at 7 pm light
Wednesday off towards St. Helena for wood or coal and
 June 26th) Same will at 4 pm left off 4 1/2 m at 11 pm heavy gale
 with heavy rain and lightning at 3 am heavy squalls
 took in fore & main and fore sail have ship to at 10 am
 wind veered shore to the westward with large sea running
 left off 8 m 1/2 set fore & main and fore sail thus end
 with frequent squalls of rain
 Salt 38.43 Log 30.33
