

Outward Bound
Sailed in bark Greyhound Capt James Soule
June 22nd 1862 at 3 o'clock p.m. we made sail
got our anchors on the bow cleared decks &c

Monday the 23rd
Commenced with light breezes in latitude
40° 5' north longitude 69° 54' West middle
part more wind saw black fish, last part
moderate all hands to work getting the
boats ready for whaling that winds up
this 24 hours

Tuesday the 24th
commenced with light breezes latitude 38° 5' ^{north}
lon 70° 4' West steering south by west all
hands employed in fitting the boats for
whaling middle part begins with light
breezes about half past 3 the wind came
around south west about 2 o'clock p.m. the
wind came around North east squally
and raining that ends this 24 hours

Wednesday 25th
This 24 hours begins with strong breezes
and cloudy all hands employed in
fitting the boats middle part squally
with thunder and lightning last part
rugged with light breezes saw some
blunt nose grampuses so that winds up
this 24 hours

Thursday 26th Lat 38° 26' North
Lon 68° 31' West
This 24 hours begins with squally weather
and rugged without much wind watch
employed in ship's duty middle part
windy and rugged with thunder and lightning
latter part strong breezes and rugged saw
2 sail of vessels steering northward and
that ends this 24 hours Mr Hazard broke
his pipe

Lat 36° 25' North
Lon 67° 28' West
