

Cruising off Western Islands Sept 25th 1862

Thursday

This day commences with light breezes and pleasant
at nine o'clock, I saw raised a school of small white
bowed down and about 16, then they were going
quick to the North East, about 2 o'clock
p.m. the wait boat struck and succeeded in killing
the whale, but the other two boats did not get
fast the whale started to windward, we came on
board about 3 o'clock and went to cutting in
at sun set we had him all on deck. We stored down
Latitude 33° 15' North
Longitude 19° 03' West

Friday September 26th

About 4 o'clock P.M. was spoken by the ship
splendid capt Smith of edgartons 7 weeks out
with 130 barrels of sperm gained with her
untill sunset

Saturday the 27th

About 2 o'clock P.M. spoke the bark Grattitude
of new bedford 3 months out with 200 barrels
sperm captan went on board and staid untill
sun set

Lat 29° 35' North
Long 19° 30' West

Sunday Oct 3rd

Making passage south in the N.E. trades about
2 o'clock p.m. raised 3 sperm whales going quick
to windward, lowered down barboard and wait
boats and pulled to windward about 2 hours
but did not see them and came on board

Lat. 20° N
Long. 19° W
