

Sunday Sept 4th 1864
Spoke the bark Thomas Winslow
Grinnell of N.B. 5 1/2 m out with
460 lbs sperm. had taken an 80
lb whale a few days previous

Lat 40° 40' N
Long 45° 42' W

Tuesday Sept 6th

At 6 p.m. raised a shoal of sperm
whales going to the N.W. lowered
and chased until dark and
returned on board, minus whales
Lat 40° 40' N
Long 45° 30' W

Monday Sept 12th 1864

About 8 A.M. raised a few whales
soon raised a large one whale. Lowered
down 2 boats and made chase chased
him until 1 p.m. and returned on
board. and chased with the ship
about 2 p.m. raised another large
whale about 3 lowered again tried
him 2 times found he was galled
and came on board, so ends this
unlucky day. Lat 40° 00' N
Long 40° 22' W

Tuesday Sept 13th

Spoke the bark John Howland whaler
3 months out with 65 lbs sperm boiling
a 6 lb whale taken the 9th

Saturday Sept 17th

About 8 A.M. raised a shoal of small
whales lowered down and the starboard
struck one. Killed and him alongside
about 1/2 past 2 p.m. He stowed down 15 lbs
Lat 39° 25' N
Long 44° 11' W

Homeward Bound
Sunday Sept 25th 1864

About 2 P.M. raised a shoal of large
whales lowered down all 3 boats and pulled
about an hour and the waist boat struck
and got stove, the other 2 boats struck her
then she cut off and came on board, not killed
and took him along side about 6 p.m.
He stowed down 47 lbs
Lat 40° 00' N
Long 48° 09' W
