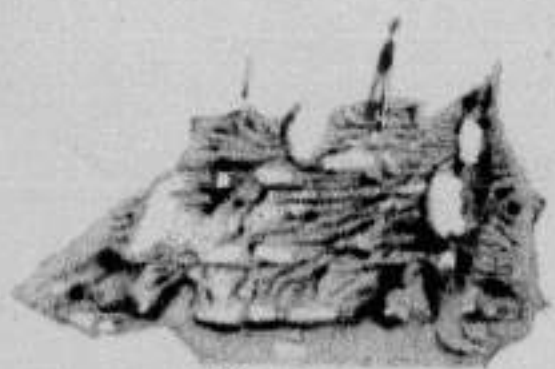




OAK

with 200 blb sperm

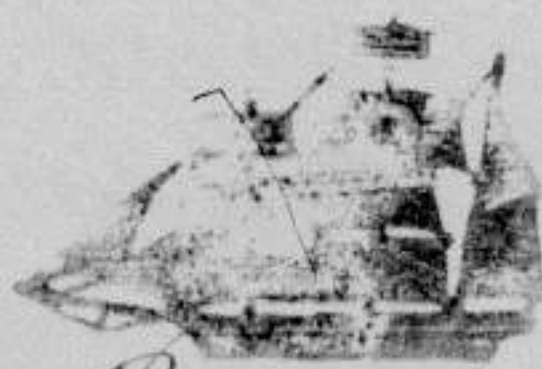
Lat 36 " 23 North

Spoke the bark Martha. Lastland
weeks out with two blb B Fish oil
Reports spoke the Cape Horn Tug
Snow with the 1200 blb all told.

Tuesday Aug 4th 1858
Spoke the bark Boussole from
Calcutta bound to Marseille let them
have some preserved meats peas &c

Lat 35 " 27 North
Long 28 " 09 West



Scopic Bird

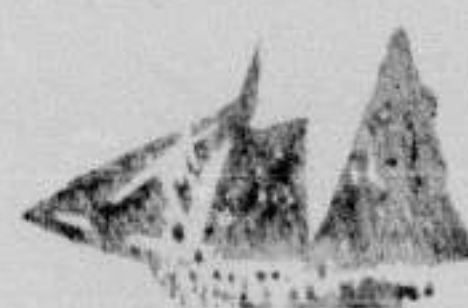
Monday Aug 24th Thurs 27th Sun 30th
Cruising off St Michaels spoke the
Bark Scopic Bird Adams - 17 1/2
months out 300 blb had taken a
whale 10 days previous of the island

Thursday Sept 4th 1858
Layed off and on at Port Praya
Terceira and got recruits a whaling
bark passed us about dark called
it the bark Atlantic Capt crew

Friday Sept 18th 1858
Touched at Port Praya for recruits

Received 4
letters

Sunday Sept 20th 1858
Came in to yard and carried the Captain
on shore and got letters. Sunday got
out and cooped oil. Tuesday landed
it and got off recruits Thursday got the
captain on board and left



A. L. Putnam

Tuesday Oct 5th 1858
Bound to St Vincent Spoke Schinner
A. L. Putnam Smith of Providence
two months out clear

Wednesday Oct 7th 1858
About 2 past eleven came to anchor
in St Vincent's Harbour. At up all
our standing rigging and sailed the
10th bound to the absolute Banks

Sunday Nov 1st 1858
Shortened sail off absolute Banks
Lat 11 " 10 South
Long 26 " 22 West

Monday Nov 11th 1858.
About 2 past eleven mist too much
whales going to the windward at
10 minutes of twelve lowered down
two larboard boats and made
chase chased them 3 times lost
run of them and came in board
