Spoke the Schooner Mary S. Carran
with of Provincetown 8 months out
with 100 bls sperm. Reported spoke
the 12th both Ensign Morgan Doctor
of Haverford 2 mos out clear

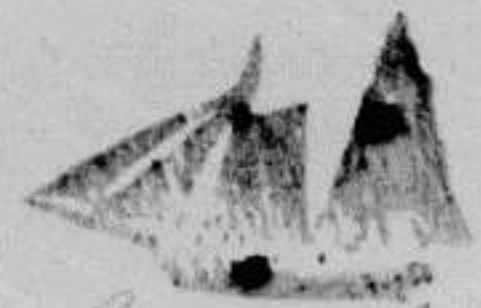

with 160 bls sperm oil

out clear, went on board it coming
sighted, stayed all night &c.

Long 48° 47' W

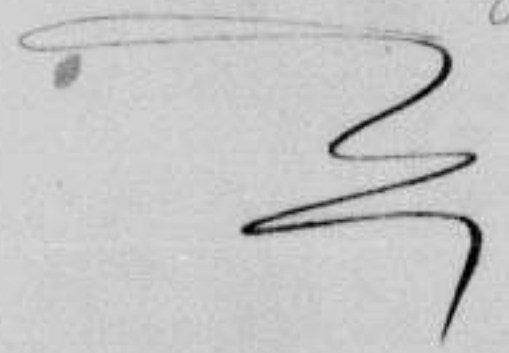

Monday Feb 14th

About 4 o'clock P.M. raised a line
whale coming to the windward at
1/2 past 4 hauled for him at 10 miles
off six the waist boat struck him
and also the barboard boat. at
1/2 past six he took both of their
lines, chased him until dark
and came on board

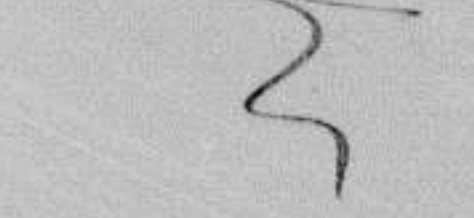


Tuesday Feb 16th

Spoke the Brig with Bradley 3 mos
had seen nothing since leaving
home in October

About half past twelve o'clock
raised a school of whales going to

lowered down and chased until
sunset and came on board unsucc.

again going to windward they were in
sight all but did not lower further
