Sunday June 29th

with 700 sperm, all told.

Sunday July 4th
At 7.40 A.M. raised a large hump
going to the N.E. at 10.30 covered 3
boats. at 1.30 struck him at 6 P.M.
took him along side

Monday July 19th
Spoke schooner *S. A. Paine* Cusson
of Provincetown no report of oil.
Lat 37° 27' N Long 43° 21' W.

Monday Aug 2nd
Spoke Bark *Spartan* Osgood
of New Bedford 3 weeks out clean
Lat 40° 19' N Long 39° 10' W.

Cape Horn Pigeon

Friday Aug 6th
Spoke Bark *Cape Horn Pigeon*
Haffard of Dartmouth, 2 weeks
out clean all well had seen nothing
Lat 40° 52' N Long 37° 31' W.

Colchis

Sunday Aug 10th
Spoke Bark *Colchis* of Boston
Green master with 100 sperm since
leaving Barbados.
Lat 38° 52' N Long 38° 45' W

Stukes

Wednesday Aug 11th
At 8.20 A.M. raised a large
sperm whale going to the eastward
at 8.45 lowered and made chase
the colchis boats soon joined in
the chase. chased until 6 P.M.
and returned on board at 7 P.M.
spoke Bark *Amie Ann* Paine
of New Bedford 2 months out clean.
Lat 39° 20' N Long 37° 45' W.

Spoke Bark *Deademonia* Davis char
also Ship *Robt Edwards* 100 sperm
this season.
