

(Bark Greyhound and Whaling Voyage)

Wednesday, 25. May, 1881

This day am fine weather light breeze ship. Cruising off the Ice Capt. and Thore and Whaler off the Ice, Mill Post and Little Post fine weather light breeze ship. off the Harbor sent a Boat in after the Capt.

Thursday, 26.

This day am fine weather ship off the Harbor the Capt. came on board at four o'clock. Shifted the Capt. for Thore. Put all hands on board much all sail and in the Eastern track. (mist & latter part light breeze ship. by the wind on the Eastern track one sail and the Ice in sight)

Friday, 27.

This day am fine weather light breeze ship by the wind on the Eastern track one sail in sight. Latter part fine weather. Spoke and saw the Bark Pioneer nothing in sight.

Saturday, 28.

This day am fine weather. Two ships coming nothing in sight. (mist part about the same. Latter part light breeze one sail in sight)

This day am fine weather. Moderate breeze ship by the wind on the Eastern track nothing in sight. (mist & latter part fine weather moderate breeze ship by the wind on the Eastern track nothing in sight)

Tuesday, 31.

This day am fine weather moderate breeze ship by the wind on the Eastern track employed doing ordinary ship duty on board nothing in sight. Latter part strong breeze ship by the wind on the Eastern track employed doing ordinary ship duty on board one steamer in sight.

Wednesday, 1.

This day am Hazy strong breeze ship by the wind on the Eastern track nothing in sight. (mist and latter part strong breeze ship by the wind on the Eastern track employed doing odd jobs on board nothing in sight)
