

Bark Greyhound and a Whaling Voyage

Sunday, 1st July - 1884

This day two boats off saw two whales chased but did not strike employed on board cutting up the whale. Boats came on board at Sun down, Latter Part two boats off but did not see anything.

Monday, 2nd This day two boats off saw three whales chased but did not strike. Boats came on board at Sun down, Latter Part two boats off cruising saw two whales and chased.

Tuesday, 3rd This day two boats off chased two whales struck to the L. Boat killed him. The ship got under way and came down and took him along side. The Bark Hancock struck a whale and got him. Latter Part all hands on board employed stowing down casks and cutting the whale.

Wednesday, 4th This day all hands on board finished cutting and boiling and rigging the boats. Latter Part three boats off cruising chased one whale employed on board boiling.

Thursday, 5th This day two boats off cruising but saw nothing. Boats came on board at Sun down. Capt Layton came on board. Latter Part three boats off cruising chased one whale employed on board boiling.

Friday, 6th This day three boats off cruising chased one whale but did not strike employed on board. Stowing down and boiling. Latter Part three boats off cruising chased two whales struck to the L. Boat but the line parted and lost the whale, employed on board boiling.

Saturday, 7th This day three boats off cruising but saw nothing. Boats came on board at Sun down, Latter Part three boats off cruising but saw nothing.

Sunday, 8th This day three boats cruising but saw nothing. Boats came on board at Sun down, Latter Part three boats off cruising saw one whale struck to the B. Boat killed him and towed him to the ship. Two boats went off, cruising employed on board cutting up the whale and nothing.
