

Remarks on board Bark Beez Hound

Monday, 2^d Sept. 1881
 This day Com Ship to anchor
 employed Baiting Latter Part took
 out anchor and started for George
 River employed Baiting

Tuesday, 3^d
 This day Com Ship Running
 up George River at Three P.M. came
 to anchor in the stream in five
 fathoms of water employed Baiting
 (mid part finished baiting Latter
 Part Ship Running up the River
 to Jinder Level water)

Wednesday, 28th
 This day Com Ship to
 anchor in the River in nine fathoms
 of water employed getting water
 finished getting water at seven
 P.M. got 3 P.M. Bait Latter Part
 took out anchor and started
 for Kambaden at four P.M. came
 to anchor about three miles
 from the Harbor. Went on board
 the L. Beared after letters

Thursday, 2^d
 This day Ship to anchor
 employed Baiting up Gaskes
 Latter Part one boat in the
 Harbor. Several Ship lying to
 anchor in the Harbor
 Latter Part fine weather light
 wind from the N.W. Ship Steady
 N.E. nothing in sight
 (Lat 33.11
 Long 2.26)

Friday, 2^d Dec. 1881
 This day Com Ship fine
 weather moderate breeze from the
 N.W. ship lying still, no nothing
 in sight at seven P.M. started
 Latter Part fine weather
 Ship cruising for whales employed
 doing ordinary ships but nothing in
 sight (Lat 34.31 S
 Long 2.57 W)

Saturday, 3^d
 This day Com Ship fine breeze from
 the North ship on the N. track
 nothing in sight but one sail at seven
 P.M. started sail. Mid P. Latter
 Part Ship. Hove two on the Port track
 Blowing a moderate Gale & Rainy
 (No. 68)

Sunday, 4th
 This day Blowing a Gale
 from the North Hove two on the
 Port track took in Fore top sail
 more wind, Mid P. Latter Part
 the same (No. 68)

Monday
 This day Com Ship Hove
 two on the Port track Blowing
 a Gale from the North & Rainy
 (mid part wind hauled to the West
 and cleared up. Latter Part Steady
 breeze Ship by the wind on the
 Port track nothing in sight
 (Lat 34.15 S
 Long 2.42 W)
