Crew still remain in jail and that end day

Sun the 5 Laying to anchor at St. Helena
and ~~the same~~ light breeze all day
and their Crew still remain in jail
do on that end day

Mon the 6 Laying to anchor at St. Helena
with moderate weather from SE
and their Crew still remain in
jail and do the work that end day

Tues the 7 Laying to anchor at St. Helena
with strong breeze from SE and rain
soon and their Crew still remaining
in jail and do the work that end day

Wed the 8 Laying to anchor at St. Helena
with moderate weather from SE
and do the ship work ended day and
their Crew still remain in jail etc

Thur the 9 Laying to St. Helena. moderate
Weather from SE so on and shipping
on board board 30 gals of black fish
head oil and do the ship work
ended day and their Crew still remain in
jail etc.

Friday March 10 1893

on this day the first and
third officers was discharged
before the American consul

Saturday March 11th

on this day at six o'clock
a Mr Mr George S. Johnson
comes on board and takes
charge as first officer with
cook Stuart cooper and fore
men before the mast on
board painting ship out side
at five P M Mr Johnson
goes on shore leaving ship
in charge of night watchman

Sunday March 12th

in St. Helena
cooper and Stuart on shore

Monday March 13th

this day in St. Helena
the Stuart comes on
board the cooper has
not come Capt Lewis
visits the ship and goes
on shore a gain so ends

Tuesday March 14th

in St. Helena
ship out side so ends

Wednesday March 15th

in St. Helena cooper
bin on shore 24 hours
Capt Lewis visits the ship
goes shore a gain
